

C RELEASE NOTES

for the BBC Master-Series Microcomputer

Please note the following points when using the Acornsoft C system:

- the version number of this C compiler is 1.00.
- *block operation bug*: there is a bug in the editor (used only with 6502 Second Processors) which may result in block operations (move/delete block) not working.
- *exit problem*: exit only prints the correct parameter if the parameters are both in the range 0 to 255 inclusive.
- *#assert*: when an assertion has failed, a message is returned containing the line at which the failure occurred and a number. This number is a pointer to the filename and not, as it should be, the filename itself.
- *switch statement*: a variable declaration immediately following a switch statement is accepted by the syntax checker, but causes unpredictable code generation errors. To overcome this, move the variable declaration out of the switch statement.
- *the editor*: the C editor provided on the system disc is for use with 6502 Second Processors. Master Turbo users will find that they automatically load the ROM based Edit which is supplied with the Master 128. If preferred, the Editor on the C system disc can be used by typing: `*\Edit`. Alternatively the Master 128 editor can be unplugged.
