Tracking the A4



FOR anyone out there who was disappointed that the portable Archimedes – the A4 – came with a mouse as standard rather than with a trackerball option, PEP Associates (0223 212251) have a solution. Logitech – the designers

of the Archimedes mouse – have developed a trackball for the PC market called the TrackMan Portable and PEP are now distributing this in the Acorn arena.

This trackball is quite novel being small and lightweight and clips on to the side of the Acorn A4 offering comfortable and efficient three button placement with a small thumb-controlled ball to move your pointer.

The TrackMan Portable has been designed so that it can be used whether you're left or right-handed and comes with driver software and a small adapter cable which plugs into the serial port and the mouse port on the A4.

The software allows you to specify in which of three orientations the mouse is being used and

which buttons correspond to Select, Menu and Adjust.

Three products are available from PEP. The full package costs £95 and consists of the TrackMan Portable mouse, a carrying case, a 9 to 25-pin serial adapter, a 9 to 6-pin PS/2 adapter, a clip attachment device, a five foot cable extension, PC software and manuals as well as the software, manual and adapter for the A4.

If you can't see yourself using the PC options then for £45 you can just buy the TrackMan, clip attachment and A4 software, manual and adapter.

On the other hand if you've already got a TrackMan Portable then £19 will buy you the software, manual and adapter to use it on the A4.

Black Art

MATT Black (0733 315439) are now distributing a wide range of quality clip-art from Canadian-based company Image Club Graphics.

These images were originally created for the Apple Macintosh and IBM PC machines in Illustrator and EPS format. Due to the features inherent in the soon to be released ArtWorks from Computer Concepts it is now relatively simple to port such graphics across to the Archimedes.

The images have been drawn by artists and the complete library contains 23 volumes on a wide variety of topics from general business to sports and from cartoons and celebrity caricatures to borders for presentations or DTP.

Each volume only costs £29.95 and there is the option to buy a catalogue of the images for £7.95 – £5 of which is refundable against your first order.

Image Club clip-art is composed of draw files which are compatible with any drawing and DTP applica-

tions that accept these, including ArtWorks, Vector, Draw, Poster, Chameleon, Impression, Ovation, Genesis and Highlighter.

Matt Black's Matthew Fifield is in the midst of negotiations to port Apple Macintosh Adobe Type 1 typefaces over to the Risc OS machines which would greatly increase the number of quality typefaces available to Archimedes users.

He is also looking into the possibility of adding a utility which lets you download the Type 1 faces so that they can be used directly with PostScript printers as easily as on the Apple Macintosh. All being well these should be available at the end of the year.

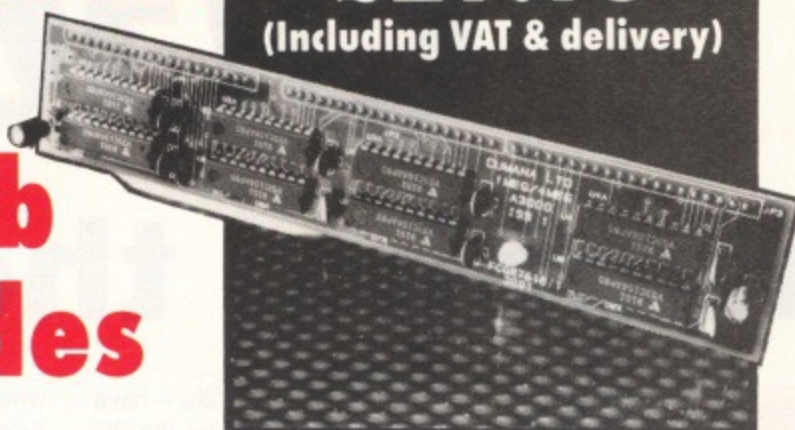

Sunny intervals

DORSET-based Spacetechn (0305 822753) have completed The Weather Desk, a multi-tasking weather satellite image gathering system which allows up to six different views of the planet to be collected concurrently. And you can still get on with other tasks on the desktop at the same time.

One example of this would be a full resolution view of Europe as an infra red image, one with the same view in visible light, another view of the whole Earth, one with the latest admin message as well as a window with a zoomed view of the UK with clouds represented in 3D projection.

In addition you can have many frames of the same view so

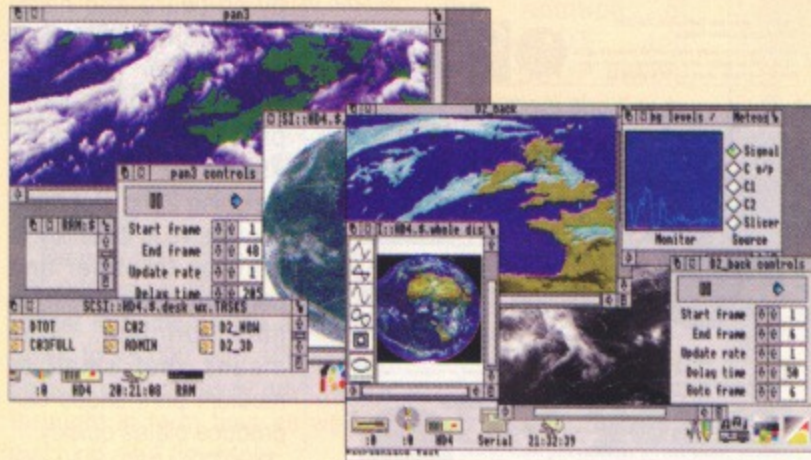
that you could have a time lapse movie of the changing weather with each sequence updated automatically as the information is downloaded from the satellite.

The Weather Desk needs 2Mb of ram and a hard disc for its advanced image collection and processing. Spacetechn have also taken into account the different

satellite formats with fully adjustable image sizes.

There are two programmable correlators for picture sync detection as well as automatic signal level calibration and an oscilloscope display of input signal and correlator output as well as a carrier frequency readout.

You can use The Weather Desk with an existing Spacetechn Satellite module and export data directly into PDSView. The package has been built around the principle of ease of use, but for the more intrepid the package is entirely open and an advanced use is documented and encouraged. A complete Meteosat station for an A3000 will cost £989.



Keep it clean

HAVE you looked at your monitor screen recently? If you can just make out the programs from the smears, probably it is time you gave it a clean. This month two separate companies have come up with difference approaches to help you to do this.

Chicopee (0256 469363) are selling a Johnson and Johnson wipe especially designed for cleaning computers and other products which attract high levels of dust.

Duster is a dry cloth which needs no additional cleaners as it

is impregnated with a pressure-sensitive pick up agent which removes more dust the harder you press. It is made from a mixture of Viscose rayon and polyester and is non-allergic and silicon-free.

If you're partial to fruit then take a look at Citrawipe from President Trading (081-533 5054). This moist J-cloth is a hard surface cleaner which removes, grime, marker pen, oil and grease as well as smells. It is non-alcohol based and as it is biodegradable it is environmentally friendly.

In the spirit

IRLAM Instruments (0895 811401) have been selected by Acorn to work with them on a major European ESPRIT project called Multiworks.

Acorn have been involved in this programme for over two years and Irlam join them to develop both video and audio compression/decompression hardware for a Risc OS-based low-cost multimedia workstation.

Multiworks has to be able to decompress real-time video and audio from CD-Rom on both Acorn and PC platforms. Irlam have experience in this area having written the first JPEG image compression software for the Archimedes and built Moving-i-Mage – the first real-time windowing video digitiser.

Work is now under way on both audio and video and working prototypes of the hardware will be shown to the European Commission this autumn. Irlam plan to develop the concept for the general market and the first result of this collaboration that Archimedes owners will see is the release of a sophisticated 16-bit audio sampling card.

Making an effect

NEW from Panasonic (0344 853552) is the KX-P4410 laser printer which has a retail price of only £845. An affordable solution for text and graphic production with a low initial outlay, it combines with modular-style easy-to-change consumables and minimal maintenance plus a two-year on-site warranty.

The KX-P4410 includes HP LaserJet II emulations so can be run from the printer driver on Archimedes Applications Discs. It gives an average print speed of five pages per minute with a 300 x 300 dpi output. The standard 0.5Mb ram can be upgraded to 4.5Mb if required.





A new concept

ACORN distributors Hugh Symons (0962 843322) have purchased the Winchester-based Concept Keyboard Company. This is their first venture into the manufacture of computer produce and is part of their strategy to develop as national distributors and vertical market dealers.

Education forms only a part of Hugh Symons' plans for future growth as they are currently evaluating many industrial and commercial applications together with wider opportunities presented by overseas markets.

New wave books

NEW from Emerald Publishing (0223 840138) are DrawBook which lets you print books made up from drawfiles using a single print command, and Technical Documentation on CD-Rom.

DrawBook treats each page as a drawfile and the sequence which makes up a book can be edited, copied or deleted with header and footer text included on each page.

The font for these headers and footers is selected from all the fonts in your System folder. As cheap low-level DTP alternative, you can use Draw to create multiple text columns and embedded text commands as well as include imported sprites. DrawBook costs £15.

The CD-Rom which is due for release this autumn will provide all the important technical documentation for Risc OS machines including Programmers' Reference manuals, DDE, C and Assembler manuals, BBC Basic manuals, Risc OS 2 and 3 User, Style and Application Guides, Midi Guide, I/O Podule Guide and TCP/IP documentation.

The files are the ones the manuals were printed from so what you'll see on screen will be the same as if you have the book in front of you.

But by using the powerful accessing software with its comprehensive search routines, note-taking facility, user-definable bookmarks and the ability to view several pages of the same or different manuals at the same time, this medium is much more flexible.

Top line printing

CALLIGRAPH (0223 461143) are well known for their direct driver laser printers for the Archimedes and their new baby is now available, the Calligraph TQ-1200. This is a 600 x 600dpi laser printer

which has an astounding list of features for £4,995 and can be used with any Archimedes although you will need 8Mb of ram.

The TQ-1200 can produce over-size A3 printing with true 600dpi which can be enhanced by software and hardware configuration to give 1200dpi.

The machine is compact measuring 490 x 455 x 210mm and weighing 23kg. But more impressive is its ability to print on to paper and polyester plates used in litho printing. This means that small to medium print shops can produce plates quickly.

The TQ-1200 is based

around a Toshiba engine capable of 300 to 1200 dpi printing produced at up to eight pages a minute.

There is a good range of paper feed options which you'd expect with a model of this quality, handling large volumes, unusual formats and heavy materials.

As standard you get an A3 250 cassette and a single sheet feeder for polyester plates and thin card. Or you could opt for a second A3 250 paper bin with the ability to select paper from either feeder as well as switching from one to another on long print runs.

Another option is the 150-sheet straight through multi-purpose stacker for envelopes, transparencies, labels, card and paper printer plates.



Video action

MAGPIE from Longman Logotron (0223 425558) is a multi-media application which can now take full motion video sequences created using Acorn Replay.

You can now add a whole new resource of computer movies without a camera or tape recorder. As with pictures, text and sounds you can include moving images by simply dragging and dropping a Replay film on a page.

In addition Magpie now supports CD Audio too, which means you can play any section or track of an ordinary audio compact disc at the press of a button. This gives everyone the ability to combine sounds and images in imaginative ways. Magpie still only costs £59 and all registered users can simply ring Longman Logotron for their free upgrade.

Making history

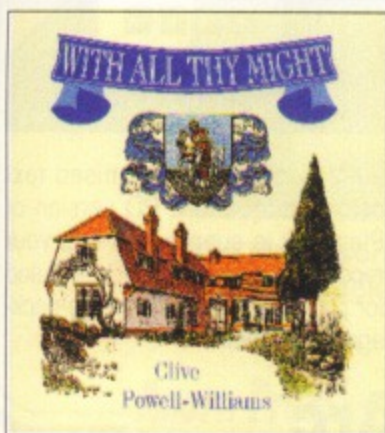

Unfortunately, some of the photographs were in such a bad con-

dition that they needed professional photographic help, but Head of IT Alan Booth was able to use Scanlight Professional to indicate to their printers the exact cropping, scaling and placement of the illustrations.

St Martin's also use the Archimedes system and CC's business supplement in their school marketing. Alan Booth commented: "It would have been far too expensive for us to use anything else. And there simply wouldn't have been a school history without it".

He was able to port the original 100,000 words in First Word Plus format into Impression and edit it down to 75,000 with 100 illustrations of camera-ready artwork in a fortnight in term time as well as teaching a full timetable.



Managing the SCSI

CUMANA (0483 503121) have launched SCSI Manager, a user-friendly management program which lets you partition SCSI hard discs and password protect key sections containing confidential data. You can also apportion read-only or write-only status to each section of the hard disc as a further safeguard.

If SCSI Manager is used with Cumana's EasyShare networking firmware you can map each section of the hard disc to a particular machine. Each hard disc can be divided into nine sections.

Full information is given on-screen and is easy to read with an online help option avoiding time-consuming and complex command line programming. SCSI Manager now comes as standard with all Cumana's SCSI/CDFS cards for the Archimedes range.

Silicon's new CAD

SOLIDCAD from Silicon Vision (081-861 2173) is now in its fifth release and is available as an upgrade for £50 to SolidCAD and Realtime Solids Modeller users.

The new features include new documentation as well as a Realtime Graphics Language Module for high-speed programmable animation and 24-bit RGB output for superb quality images on a standard Archimedes display.

Output has also been improved with the addition of SuperPLOT and SuperDUMP drivers for plotters and Epson compatible printers, while the high-speed rendering provides texture mapping and smooth-shading in less than two seconds.

Industry-standard networking

JULY'S AccessIT conference in Nottingham saw Oak Solutions (0274 620423) launch their new high performance networking system for the Archimedes.

ClassNet is a strategy rather than just a system. Networking can begin with ClassRom which makes a single high-speed hard disc look like two drives - one for applications and one for data.

The former is read-only with the applications drive being read/write. Management of the ClassRom is password protected.

A complete system including SCSI interface and hard disc is available for all machines. If you

have an A5000 a small interface board can be added which converts the existing hard disc to a ClassRom which works as well on a stand alone machine as it does in a networked cluster with an optimum ratio on 1:4 but introduces the next stage of the system ClassShare.

ClassShare uses the ClassNet interface to connect computers together. In use ClassShare is the same as ClassRom and you wouldn't know you're connected to other machines as there is no log on to a file server.

As far as you are concerned you simply have high speed access to

a local ClassRom.

ClassShare uses standard hardware, SCSI, ADFS hard discs and Ethernet interfaces and cable. You also have the option of expanding ClassShare to a full network using the same technology by simply adding more computers and file server.

ClassNet provides an alternative to Eiconet or it can run parallel to the ClassNet's Ethernet cabling. ClassNet is easy to install needing only a ClassNet interface - the Ethernet equivalent of an Eiconet interface.

Machines are connected using standard Ethernet cabling and

existing Level 4 file servers can be connected directly with Level 3 and FileStore file servers accessed via a ClassNet/Eiconet gateway.

ClassNet understands all the existing Eiconet instructions and the gateway between the two systems automatically translates information between the two systems while all network transactions remain transparent to the users.

Unix machines use NFS and Acorn's AUN allowing Archimedes fitted with ClassNet to communicate with NFS file servers. Oak are also working on gateways to link ClassNet to a variety of other networking systems.



Green issues

EUROPE'S leading manufacture of recycled paper, Olives Papers (061-436 7100), have launched two new ranges of *green* listing paper. Laz-a-lyst is a high quality 100 per cent recycled paper made from reclaimed printed paper and industry waste.

It is guaranteed not to contain any virgin pulp and its colour and texture are on a par with non-recycled paper. For people who want to be seen to be green there is Olives' Concept listing paper. This is made entirely from post-consumer waste which is cleaned and filtered but not de-inked. This gives a white but slightly speckled sheet.

Both products have a smooth finish and are available as music lines or plain in 11x14.5in and 11x9.5in sizes. There are 2,000 60gsm sheets in a box for £9.

Screen law

THE end of the year will see new laws to regulate how computer users run their installations based on European Commission Directives including how people work with screen-based systems.

The National Computing Centre (NCC) have collated the results of an informal survey among their 2,500 member organisations concerning working with display

screen equipment.

The comments of the NCC members suggest that the major problem they envisage with this new legislation is interpretation rather than cost.

In particular they criticised vagueness, subjectivity and lack of rigorous specifications or measurements within the draft document.

Links design

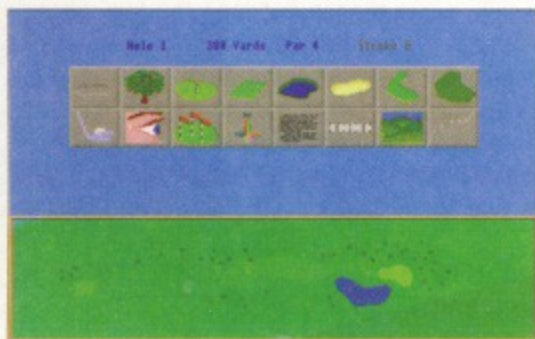
NEW look CIS (071-226 3340) are about to release their first product which will also enhance the successful MicroDrive and MicroDrive International. A golf simulator which is more than a golf arcade game, MicroDrive has been enhanced by its new sister program MicroDrive Designer.

This gives you the ability to create your own 18 hole golf course. Full details, a walk through guide and golfing advice will be part of the comprehensive documentation, but the program has been designed to be allow you to create an accurate simulation.

As well as the designer the finished version will give you sample courses, horizons for those who don't want to create their own and a program to allow you to make your own course discs.

The initial screen gives you a set of icons which lead into sub-programs giving you 48 types of trees to choose from, a range of rivers, ponds and lakes and green sizes which can be flipped and rotated enlarged or reduced to fit with your game plan.

The fairway, rough and out of bounds areas can be finely adjusted and everything is controlled via the mouse. One particularly nice feature is the intelligent flag positioning. You can add dips and hills where you want and view them in a 3D matrix form too. The program will tell you where the flag can be, taking into account the lie of the land.



Add to this the length, the expected par rating as well as the angle and location of the tee and you're ready to start – the program does check to make sure that you have included all the vital elements. For £24.95 you could create a course fit for Nick Faldo.

Used in evidence

PLAYBACK is a new utility from Risc Developments (0727 40303) which records in real-time all the mouse and keyboard operations as they happen. You can use this package to create demonstrations of programs which run on the desktop.

As you have recorded and saved all the mouse movement and key presses on the replay you can see exactly what happened – the mouse pointer follows all the recorded movements and button clicks and text appears on screen as if it was typed from the keyboard. Even the speed is the same.

You can record up to an hour and your efforts can be converted to text format for editing. It is also relatively



easy to add a synchronised text commentary and a PD version of PlayBack is supplied so that your recordings can be freely distributed for play-back only. The whole package costs £19.

State of the Arc

A NEW engineering consultancy, State Machine (0582 484266), dedicated to advancing the capabilities of the Archimedes has been founded by Chris Honey and Justin Fielder who were previously working on projects for Watford Electronics and Computer Concepts.

Their first release is a graphics accelerator card which will tackle the Archimedes existing limitation in the areas of colour palette selection and screen mode size while remaining fully compatible with Risc OS 2 and 3.

This new card reduces video circuit loading on the central Arm processor by up to 50 per cent and displays fully usable 256-colour 800x600 resolution or 16-colour 1,024x768 pixel screen modes on any multisync or SVGA monitor.

Certain high resolution monitors will also be capable of displaying 1,152x852 16-colour or 1,280x1,024 4-colour Archimedes screen modes with a special virtual window mode allowing super large images to be panned and scrolled using an ordinary monitor.

Standard screen modes will also benefit with the more memory hungry Mode 21 screens moving some of their processing to the accelerator card giving much faster speeds.

A 24-bit palette is also provided to increase the number of available colours from just 4,096 to 16.7 million hues. This will give some very high quality 256 grey scale displays and will let Archimedes owners enjoy the graphic capabilities of some of the top-end PCs and Apple Macintoshes.

The card is due for release in September with a price tag of around £250. A professional version is expected soon, which, in addition to the features above, will also have full 24-bit true colour, gamma corrected graphics up to a resolution of 800x600 pixels.

With this card an Archimedes could display photo-realistic quality images and retain the Risc OS desktop compatibility for the first time. The price of the professional card will probably be under £750.

Sounds good

MUSIC lovers will be interested to hear of a new application due to be released in the autumn with the working title of Digital Symphony. The program is being written by the Belgium BASS team – well known in the 32-bit public domain because of a host of useful programs, some of which were reviewed in *The Micro User* last month and featured on the subscription disc.

Symphony is a commercial version of ProTracker which has been enhanced and now includes editing features and is marketed in this country by Oregan Software (021-353 6044) with a provisional price of £50.

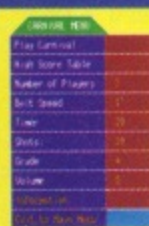

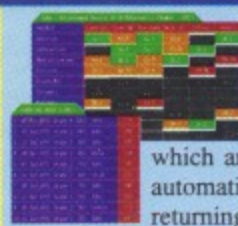

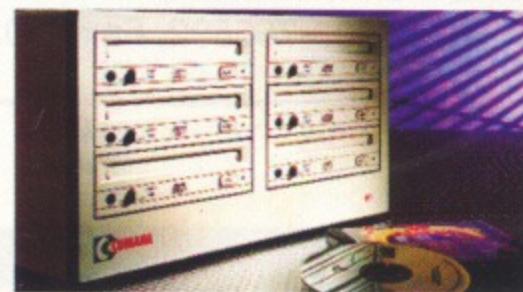

It's alive and kicking on CD-Rom

There are 36 minutes of video using Acorn's Replay system, a full dictionary of biological terms, details on over 5,000 species with photos, video clips and sounds of the animals in the wild as well as distribution maps and of course it is fully multi-tasking.

Another five CD-Roms are due between now and Christmas. The first will be Grooves - a collection of clip-audio which can be accessed on music CD or through the Archimedes which will let you design a play list in background mode in a multi-tasking environment. The sound effects and music pieces in a range of styles can be exported to Genesis or into demos and presentations.

The Image Warehouse will be next with a selection of full colour clip-art in sprite format. Some of the artwork will be 1200x800 pixels in size and the sprites will be divided into four directories. There's Mode 28 and Mode 15, with the other two containing small versions of the same pictures. These will fit on screen and can be used for backgrounds or sections grabbed for further work via ChangeFSI or the carousel utilities.

The final three releases all return to the wildlife theme. Creepy Crawlies, as the

name implies, will cover snakes, spiders and the like. There are a total of 71 entries each with a full motion video 30 second clip, a large picture, text and narration as well as a family tree and classification. There is a total of 41 minutes of extremely high quality video.

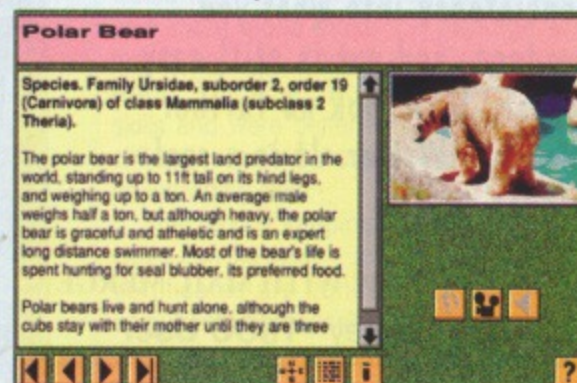
One particularly nice feature is the ability to access the database in French or English. The language level will also change depending on the age of the reader.

At present you can choose between 7 or 14-year-old standard though Media Design plan to add more age ranges and a wider selection of languages.

Cute and Cuddlies will be in a similar format but will feature such animals as the koala bear. Dinosaurs are always popular and the Dinosaur CD will be the last release this year.

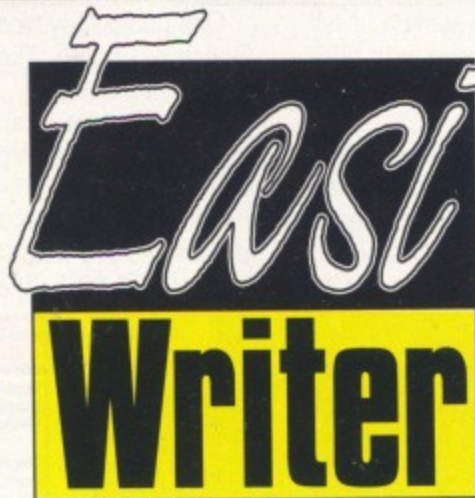

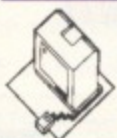

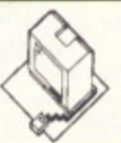

Home-based learning

Rog Frost sits down with children and parents to look at a suite of mathematical programs

PARENTS are very aware of the needs and rights of their children. And a real bonus is the opportunity to have a program which is tied into the National Curriculum so that parents can know whether their child is fulfilling their potential.

This suite of programs is aimed fairly and squarely at the home market, though it could find a place in schools.

For your money you get a range of six activities. These take the form of games, each of which has a mathematical element. Where appropriate, the games have different grades. These should be seen as ways of practising different skills rather than as levels of difficulty.

Number skills

The skills covered by the whole package are addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, plus percentages, fractions, decimals, estimation, units and powers – a lot of the number skills required by the National Curriculum.

The first game is **Carnival**. A numerical problem appears in the centre of the screen, and above and below it numbers sail past on a conveyor. When you see the right answer, you take aim by moving the mouse then fire.

Levels vary and should allow children of a wide age to use this program. Up to four youngsters can play against each other, each being given the default 10 questions. The speed of the conveyor can be altered from very slow to impossibly fast and you can decide whether to play against the clock or just work at your own speed.

Sound effects are pleasing and appropriate and like all the games, the ending involves an on-screen fireworks display with sound effects and the oohs and ahs of the crowd.

Cover Up is a variant of the old favourite, the pairs game or Pelmanism. Two sets of numbers appear, above and below the line, and they have to be matched. It sounds easy

and at the simplest grade it is, but matching a later complex addition sum with possible answers is much harder.

The game can be made more challenging by having more numbers to choose from and the real masochists can have doors that only reveal the numbers for a short time. A good memory is needed as well as the ability to do arithmetic, and the game is entertaining and spans a wide age range.

Next comes **Grab**. A sum is displayed at the bottom of the screen then a set of possible answers appears. The task is to move the hand to the correct answer and grab it. It's essentially simple except that the numbers keep moving with the idea – and it is a good one – of making youngsters adopt the strategy of estimation.

I used a different strategy of just working out the units digit and looking for an answer that matched that. It worked well. Graphics do make a difference in this type of game and F7, F8, F9 pressed while on the main game menu screen changes the graphics and you can choose those more suitable to the age or interest of the next child to play.

Appealing

Cheers is snakes and ladders. The die spin, you answer the question correctly and you can move the counter forwards. Apart from dealing with the questions, you need to think about where you'll end up because you can reject a move which takes you to the top of a long snake. This appealed to children and adults, as a parent or teacher can add their own set of

questions.

The **Big Bang** scenario involves preventing a nuclear power station from exploding. Its temperature is kept in check by answering questions fully and is a good exercise in scale reading. A sum appears on screen and you must answer the questions by clicking on the right part of the gauge. Get them wrong and the reactor can get too cold or too hot.

Silicon Brain is the final program and is based around a calculator. The game element involves using it as quickly as possible. A nice touch is that key presses are recorded at the bottom of the screen.

If a youngster gets things wrong and can't understand why, an adult should be able to sort out the problem by looking at this record.

The bonus for parents must be the built-in National Curriculum information. An achievement record is available for each player showing the various parts of the National Curriculum covered by the games.

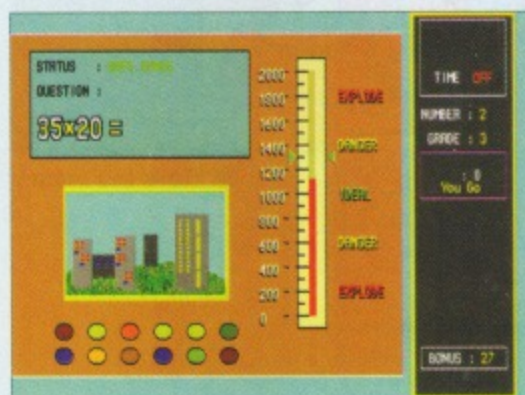
All the numbers – representing the grade and attainment target – start black but as a game is tried – and a certain percentage of questions are answered correctly – they go red, then yellow, green and blue as the score gets to 100 per cent.

Good news for parents is the option – usually only extended to schools – of ordering 10 out of 10 with the proviso that if they don't like it they can return the product within two weeks for a full refund.

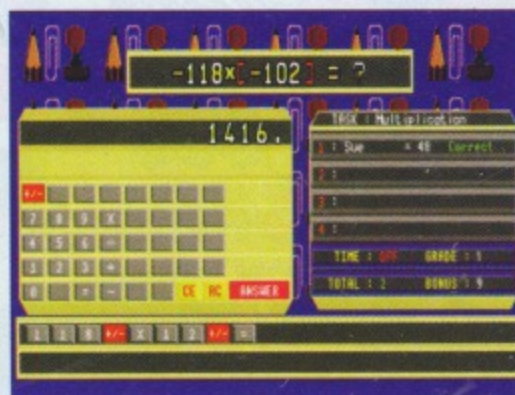
Summing up

Overall this is a useful set of programs. I would rate Carnival and Cover Up highest and these alone make the package worth the money with Cheers and Grab as useful extras. The other two games practise extra skills and were better received by the older children allowing the package to grow with an individual child.

The record keeping – those of a whole class can be kept – and the ability to print certificates are bonuses. 10 out of 10 is unique in home-based programs because of the National Curriculum link and it makes a good resource for parents as well as good educational fun for children.

THERE may be a lot of controversy over Europe, and politicians may be in a quandary about what to do next, but education is moving forward in its own way. Le Monde à Moi is a small contribution to the overall pattern of events.

A direct development of My World which was reviewed in the June 1992 issue, Le Monde à Moi lets you manipulate graphics screens simply and effectively but with a French flavour.

It is a very friendly and flexible package specifically designed to aid and stimulate the oral use of French and as it is a direct offshoot of My World it is difficult to categorise due to its open-ended nature.

Text and graphics can be combined in any manner depending on your requirements. The program gives all menu selections and options in French with the only exceptions being the more technical terms which are given in English to eliminate any confusion.

In its basic form Le Monde à Moi is a collection of graphic screens on which you can place and move objects. Clicking the Select button picks up an object and you can take your finger off the button as you drag it, clicking again only to drop it.

This is a useful feature and I wish that more software houses would use it because it is especially useful with younger children or those that find the usual method hard work.

Text can be added to screens, where it too

becomes a movable object which can be placed anywhere on screen. Different fonts can be used as can colours and sizes.

Accents on characters are produced by pressing the Alt key at the same time as another key. Make sure that you clicked on the !Accents icon first to access this feature. All movable objects can be deleted if you want.

Work can of course be saved to disc and printing can be in either portrait or landscape format and output with the library of all the copiable objects or just the work screen with the placed objects.

The screens provided with Le Monde à Moi are: Cafe, En ville, L'heure, L'ours, Maison, Marché, Visage, Meteo, Alien, Cafetext1,

Cafetext2, Les courses and Mots mixtures.

These screens, or ecrans, have been specifically developed by Derbyshire teachers. As with My World, screens can be developed using Draw or you can send your ideas to NW Semerc and they will design them for you.

Summing up

Le Monde à Moi is very easy to use and can be used with a wide variety of ages and abilities. The screens provided give a good selection for use in the classroom or home. Vive Semerc Nord-Ouest!

LOGOTRON have been at it again, producing more packages in the Landmarks series. For those of you who have not yet come across these they are linked to – though usable without – the school's TV program of the same name.

The format of each is identical – an illustrated text adventure. The screen runs with two windows, one for the dialogue and one for the pictures. The pictures do not change with each location but appear when relevant.

All pictures are in black and white which is not in itself a bad thing. Unfortunately they are either poor originals or poorly scanned so they only occasionally excite but they do keep up the interest.

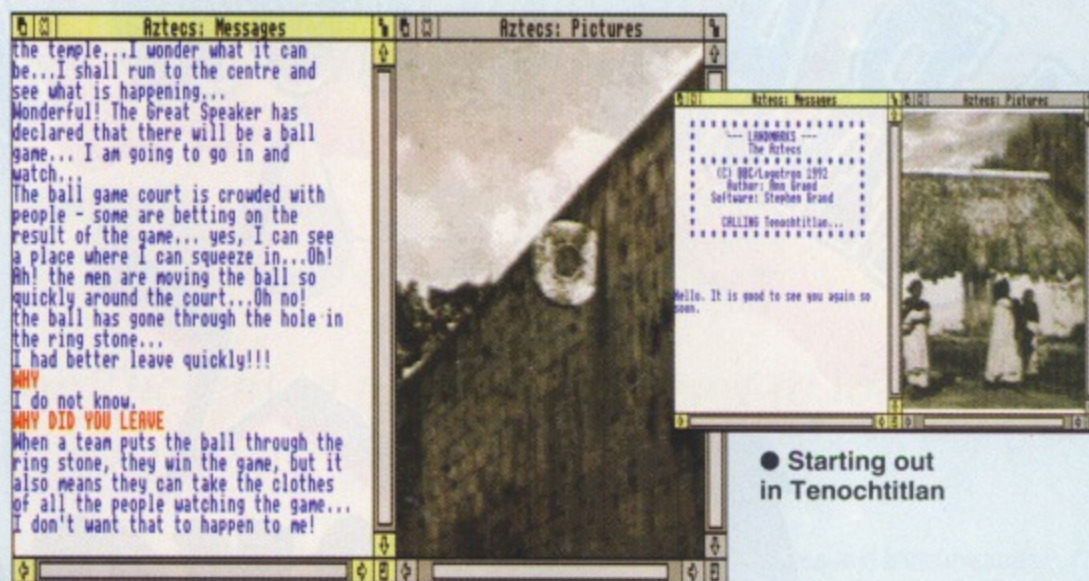
The games are very much like text adventures with extremely large vocabularies and a parser that only occasionally lets you down.

However, they are not adventures in the sense that you have to find the treasure and save the dragon, they are really environments to explore. The latest two cover the topics of the Aztecs and Columbus.

So let's take ourselves back in time to the Aztec city of Tenochtitlan. Jade Doll is our guide, a 10 year old girl. Her mother is currently in bed after the birth of a son with Old Golden Flower, the midwife, on hand to help. This means that Jade Doll has a few days to show us around before her mother is up and giving her jobs to do.

One of the first things she does is make a

sacrifice by pricking her finger, explaining that this is to feed the gods of the earth.

As we explore the market we meet the market inspector: The parser is working well – say hello and he replies with a good morning. If you ask what he does you're given a good explanation of the duties of an Aztec trading standards officer.

The city is built on various artificial islands, called chinampas, surrounded by a lake. There's plenty more to see with heads on poles, temples, water sellers – the everyday Aztec life. Really the thing to do is stroll around and take it all in.

Jade Doll doesn't quite have the voice of some of the other Landmarks characters but she is still fairly real and certainly complains if you make her do too much walking.

This is good as it stops children just rushing

about the place and they have to think of more constructive ways to pass the time.

All the Landmarks programs are linked into the computer's real time clock and during the three days of the game, events happen at pre-set time – in the Aztec program we have a wedding and a ball game.

This can be rather irritating because if the children are not playing at the right time they can miss them. The manuals are a bit vague on what you can do about this

so, after a little floundering, the following solution presented itself.

First load the alarm program from Applications disc 2. You can use this to set the clock much more easily than the command line instructions in the Landmarks manual.

The program seems to record the time it started so first you need to set your clock to an earlier time than the first event. In the Aztec program this is at 11am so set the clock for 10am.

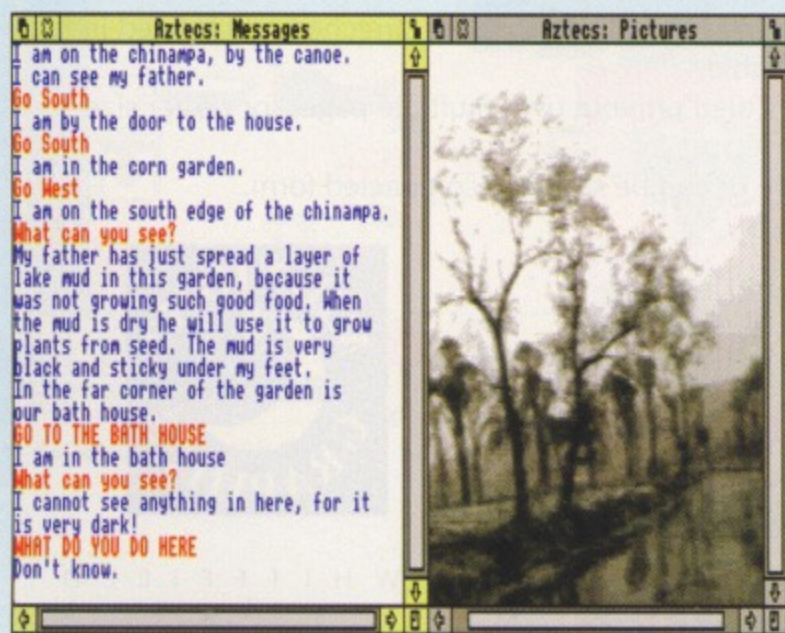
Load the program for a new game and type RESET if it is an old game. Now you can go to the temple precinct, set the clock to 11am and there's the wedding. After that you can go to the ball court and set the clock to 2pm to see the ball game. You have to do this in sequence as you can't move backwards in time.

In the Columbus program we find ourselves on the Santa Maria with Pedro, cabin boy to Captain Colon, on route to the East Indies.

As you're on a ship you need to head to port, starboard, fore and aft. Luckily a plan of the ship is provided for the nautically disadvantaged. One of Pedro's jobs is to turn the sandglass every half hour so you have to get used to him rushing off.

On the first day there's plenty going on aboard ship with speed to be checked, floggings to watch and a leg to be sawn off. If you're feeling sneaky you and Pedro can go to the captain's cabin and read the log and charts. If you're hungry don't go to the hold unless you like maggots.

Over the first night land is sighted and the following day you and Pedro go ashore with the captain. Unlike the other programs the island is not mapped and that turns out to be the main task. Here the program really man-

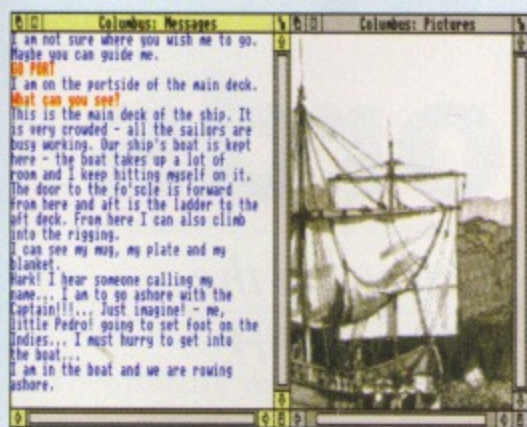

ages to create and atmosphere of discovery. Mapping skills are therefore developed and the exploration seems very real. This aspect of Columbus really sets it apart from the other programs in the series.

Both packages are very well documented and supported with teachers' and children's materials. This is very important because it stops the explorations of these environments becoming aimless and sterile.

While the notes protest that the aim of the program is not to do the worksheets I can imagine most teachers will make full use of them as the basis for the work.

Summing up

Both programs cover very specific areas of the National Curriculum at junior school level but it is nice to see the continued production of packages that encourage the kind of cross-curricular work that is in danger of disappearing. You could make a lot of either of these.

The only reservation is whether a class can afford the time it might take to get all the children through the activities.

AS if continuous assessment wasn't enough, schools, especially secondary, are being expected to produce more and more in the way of statistical analysis of exam results.

The result is that teachers are finding themselves with huge amounts of data to process – and the computer is a fairly obvious candidate for easing the load.

Enter ArcMark, a computerised mark book from Australian publishers Eureka. There's nothing at all surprising about this package, it is firmly based on the kind of layout you would expect in a mark book with columns for names and marks.

The program uses a rather greedy 900k and can create markbook files of 10 classes with up to 40 students each and 78 sets of marks.

The screen is divided into four. The first gives exam information including a text field for the name of the test, a total mark – the highest mark possible – and an optional weighting.

Four different types of exam can be dealt with using combinations of class or year exams and letter or numerical scores. Mean scores and standard deviations are also displayed. The means can be either for the particular class or, in the case of a year exam, for the whole year group.

The second area displays the class title and size while a third shows the students' names.

This is cross-referenced with the exam area to produce the fourth, mark area. Marks are simply entered into the cells created between student and exam – basically a spreadsheet – by clicking and typing.

And that's about it but there are some clever tricks available. For instance you can change the total mark of an exam and automatically re-scale all the student marks in the light of that new total. You can also automatically grade marks and use ranks – which is all fairly useful stuff.

Along with this you get everything you would expect in terms of copying, sorting and so on. The whole thing is really quite well put together, the setting up of exams is simple and

the statistical manipulation offered relevant and useful.

There are, however, other considerations. No matter what package you use you must bare in mind the fact that this information is covered by the Data Protection Act – it's no longer confidential the minute it's on the computer.

That aside this program is useful as it stands but it's not flexible. With all the changes being thrust upon us who knows what kind of statistics we will be expected to produce next year?

Setting up a spreadsheet to do the same job would be quite a task but you would have more control.

The single user price is expensive but a site licence for a large school is £115 and if half a dozen departments got a year's use, it's not a bad buy – even if only to guide you to the kind of tailor-made system you need.

ESENTIALLY World Map Study is a collection of data with a program to allow users to access and analyse it. Some 171 countries are included.

My review copy is out of date, but with the pace of change in Eastern Europe and the old Soviet Union, it must be just about impossible to keep things topical. With that proviso, though, it is fair to say that the program does cover the entire, inhabited world.

It is loaded in the normal way and to start with, a map of the world is displayed. The left hand side of the screen has a toolbox, or set of options, rather like Draw.

If information is required about a particular country, you can select it in three ways: Point and shoot, select from an alphabetical list or type in the name of the country.

The chosen country will be highlighted on the world map. The magnifier icon can then be selected from the toolbox to show a closer view of the relevant region of the world, or you can zoom in closer for an outline of the country itself.

The familiar information icon will create a very stylish display of facts about the country. This is divided into a number of categories.

There is some general information about the country – the official name, capital city, currency, type of government and so on together with the national flag.

Next come some general geographical detail concerning land area, length of coastline and land usage.

This is followed by population information – size, growth rate and density. In the Health data section you can learn about life expectancy, fertility rates and so on. The People section also has information on literacy levels.

Then come the economic statistics for the country. The final section covers beliefs and gives an indication of the proportion of the population who follow the major world religions or have other, traditional beliefs.

Each page of data can be printed or saved as a sprite. Don't worry if you think sprites are

rather a messy way of saving data, text can be saved in its entirety as a standard text file.

The flag picture can be saved as a standard drawfile and all maps can be similarly stored on disc. This makes World Map Study an ideal companion to any DTP program including, of course, DeskTop Folio.

The three graph options really make the program come into its own. The first is to colour a map of the world or region according to the level of a chosen feature. The map then displays different colours representing ranges of population density.

This shows general information at a glance and, by the usual point and shoot technique, different countries can be highlighted and the detail displayed.

The next option is to display information as a bar chart. You could, for example, select female life expectancy. By default, the seven top and bottom countries are displayed along with the selected country. This can be altered, easily, in a number of ways.

You can toggle the display between all countries in the world or just those in the chosen area. The chart may be considerably enlarged to include all the countries. 171 bars will not fit on the screen but standard scroll bars allow easy access to any part of it.

The final option is to have an outline profile chart. Even on this, it is possible to point and

shoot to get detailed information for any country.

Finally there are scatter graphs. Here, 171 dots are displayed on screen. Each dot represents a country's status for two fields of data.

The X axis, for example, might represent the money spent on defence while the Y axis could be the length of coastline. This is where real skill comes in since you must decide if the graph shows a pattern or if the dots are just scattered.

Scatter graphs also bring us to the National Curriculum. Pupils are expected to study a developing country and this pack allows them to identify one and obtain a lot of data.

In fact, the program has uses across all four key stages as it can be used for recognising different countries or for very detailed research.

Provision to alter information is built in, in a separate editor program. This is simple to use and allows changes to be made or whole new categories of information to be added. Unfortunately, there does not seem to be an option to add new countries.

The manual is an attractive A5-sized ring binder. Curriculum advice comes first followed by the operating instructions which are really not needed. World Map Study is a totally standard, multi-tasking program – using it is really a doddle.

One criticism is that the single user disc cannot be copied. I panic if I don't have a back-up! For secondary school use though, the very reasonable site licence allows for unlimited on-site copies.

Summing up

This program is a sure-fire winner. It is reasonably priced and geared squarely at the National Curriculum.

It fills a much needed niche and allows pupils to investigate the nature of the different countries of the world with ease. The ability to export maps, flags and text to other programs is an added bonus.

AS readers will know I have a very long standing interest in image processing and video digitisers. So when I saw the advertisement for HCCS's offering I just had to take a look.

For a start the price looked very good – almost too good – and the advertisement did not give away much technical information. When that happens there's usually a reason and I wanted to find it. However, I was pleasantly surprised to find it much better than my expectations.

For a start, one way you can reduce the cost of a digitiser is to slow down the acquisition speed and spread it over several frames. However, this digitises in real time, that is the time for a single frame. This is important because it means that the subject does not have to remain still.

Another way of cutting costs is to reduce the number of bits in the analogue to digital converter but here again I was pleased to see it used 6 bits.

This would give 64 different grey levels, much more than the 16 the computer display

can show. Also there will be an upgrade available later in the summer to use eight bits, that's 256 grey levels. An empty socket on the board supports a forthcoming colour upgrade.

Well how is the price kept down? For a start much is made of programmable logic arrays – these clever little chips can pack a lot of functions in a small space.

Also all the software to drive the board is supplied on disc and not on an on-board eeprom like many other podules – this is slightly naughty as it breaks Acorn's guidelines about podule identification.

All podules are supposed to have 32 bytes of memory to act as an ID to the system. According to Acorn the system used here, using only 1 byte, is meant to be used only

temporarily during prototyping.

The result is that when you issue a *Podules command it does not report the HCCS video digitiser nor report *No installed podule* but gives a blank line.

To be fair this is not likely to give you any trouble until another manufacturer tries the same trick, then you may – but it is by no means certain – get some software clashes.

The HCCS software is fully multitasking and adheres to the Desktop guidelines and here perhaps lies the difficulty with this product: The act of acquiring and displaying a picture is very time consuming and your Wimp clicks are serviced very slowly.

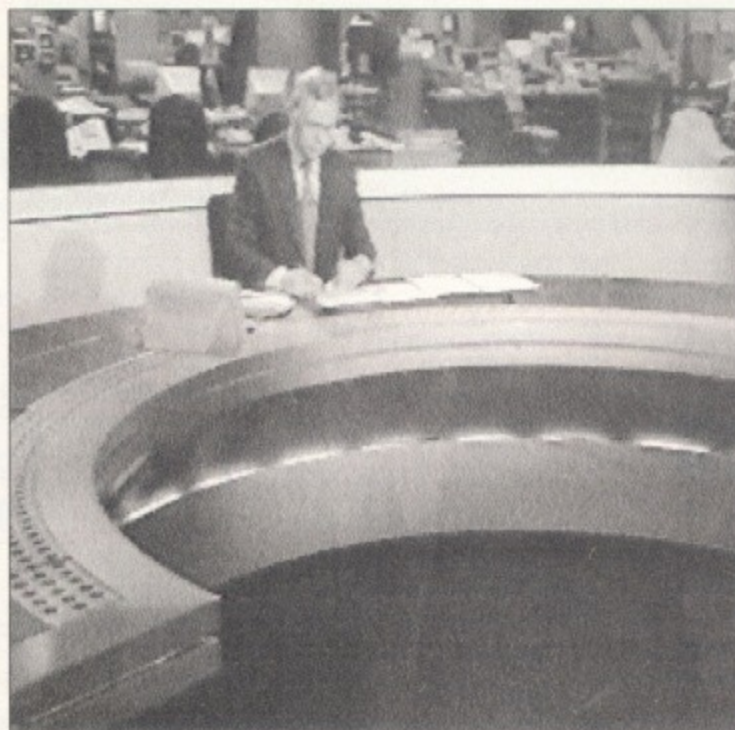
According to the on-disc manual the frames are displayed every second. That means although they are snapped in a single frame there is a delay before you see the new picture. This is just over a second in mode 12 but

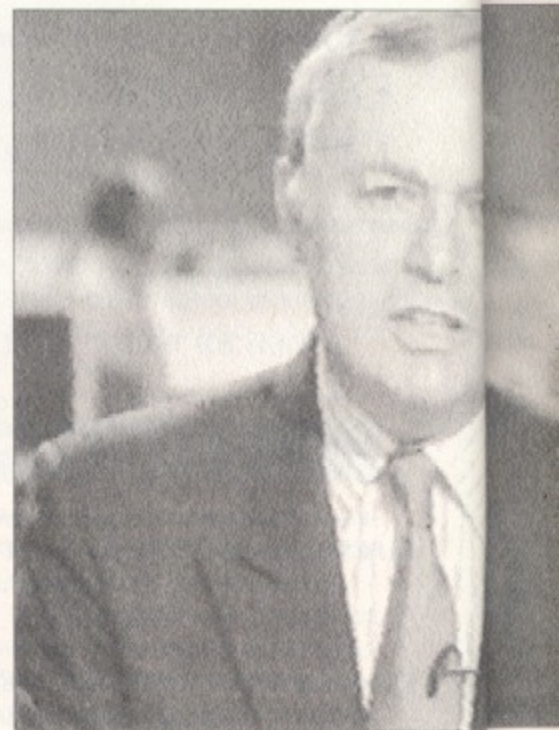

increases to about two seconds in mode 15 and four seconds in mode 21.

Of course the picture quality improves all the time but having to operate the Desktop with a four-second delay between each action is rather like wading through treacle. On the other hand, you are not likely to be wanting to do much else when you are grabbing images.

Images are initially displayed in a *low quality mode*, meaning with little processing. This can result in some patterning from the colour sub-carrier, if you have a colour source.

A menu option allows this to be processed to what is referred to as a high quality 256 grey scale image that will usually remove the colour sub-carrier patterning.

There is no way the computer can display 256 grey shades – the hardware limits it to 16. However, the processing dithers the picture to get a better image, just like some printer dumps produce shades from just black and white dots.

This improvement is more noticeable in the lower resolution modes like Mode 12 – it takes about 12 seconds. A brightness and contrast adjustment can be made while the images are being grabbed, which is very convenient.

The image acquisition software has a continuous mode where frames are shown as fast as possible. The manual says *when you see a picture you like, just click on the process menu option*.

In practice what happens is that the next frame is grabbed and that is the one that is processed. This coupled with the low screen update rate makes picking the right frame in a sequence quite tricky. You can save images

as sprite files both in processed and unprocessed form. But there is no way to load in an unprocessed image to receive processing at a later time.

It is worth remembering that the image sprite produced will have the characteristics of the mode in which it was produced so you can't use the lower modes for better response and then use the sprite in the higher modes and get any improvement.

The error trapping of the software was a cause for concern: All errors are considered to be fatal and the application will quit. On several occasions I had spent some time getting a good image, then tried to save it to disc. I got a disc full error box and the program quit taking my picture with it.

This is very frustrating, and it would be nice if the distinction was made between recoverable and non-recoverable errors.

Summing up

With any video digitiser the quality is dictated by the video source. Having said that the HCCS digitiser certainly makes the most of the signal you send it.

The quality of the resultant images was excellent and made the most of the computer's display capability.

It would certainly benefit from more responsive frame grabbing software, even at the expense of not being desktop compatible. But do not let that put you off too much, the nature of a review often tends to be over critical.

The HCCS Video Digitiser is excellent value for money and produces some really excellent results.

don't have the skills or inclination for free format painting.

With *Illusionist* you create a wire frame outline of your image using pre defined shapes. In addition you can define your own shapes or distort any existing shapes. This makes it very easy to generate images even if you can't draw a straight line. You can assign colours and textures to your objects. You can even give them texture maps. A texture map is any Mode 12 or 13 screen. So you can use a scanned or digitised image, a painting – literally anything!

Render Bender II is another top rated graphics package from Clares. Images are created in a similar way to *Illusionist* by defining objects using pre defined shapes. You then add colour, texture, lighting etc. *Render Bender* images can include glass and mirror objects as well as shadowing. *Render Bender* actually calculates the path of light from its source to the imaginary eye at the viewing position. This path takes account of any reflections and refractions.

In addition *Render Bender* can create animated sequences very easily. You can either give objects a formula to control their movement or you can give start and end positions and ask the program to 'in between' the other frames. The result is a stand alone animation that can be passed to friends or even sold.

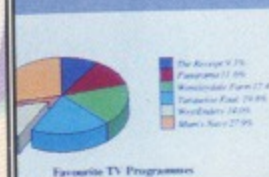

WE have been using one of the original IdeA A3000 internal hard drives for over a year now and have found it to be very reliable. But this year ICS have released a whole new range called IdeA'92.

For the A3000 you get a 2.5in hard disc unit, about 5in long and 0.5in deep and slightly over 2.5in wide which sits crossways along the back of the micro behind the removable panel.

Fitting is easy: It's just a matter of siting the pins correctly – it will only go in one way round and it's obvious what to do. There's one flying lead to plug in which could potentially go the wrong way round, but the instructions are very clear.

Getting the lid off an A3000 can be tricky the first time you try it, and unfortunately it's even trickier getting it back on. Some sections fit inside the main casing while others lie outside, and it's not always clear which is which. However, the plastic is flexible enough and can take a lot of abuse.

The software is contained on a socketed – hence replaceable – eprom. We had an upgrade shortly after receiving the original last year and it was a simple matter of swapping the chips.

When you switch on, the hard drive icon pops up and, if you are in a quiet room, you can hear the drive spinning up to speed. It comes already formatted, so you can get going straightaway, copying over your applications and data files.

As with most hardware, if it works it works, and if it doesn't it's broken. So in use the IdeA drive works fine and there have been no long term problems.

The new range of IDE drives from ICS consists of newly-designed hardware and completely re-written software which has some features making it ideal for home use. The most

significant improvement has been the addition of password protection and disc partitioning. From software you can create up to four partitions of the disc, each appearing as a separate disc drive icon on the icon bar.

Each drive can have one of four levels of password protection: No protection; read/write but password needed to alter the protection level; read only; and no access without password.

This means that all applications can be put on one drive and set to read only, then no changes can be made to them. Some private areas can be completely protected, and the rest of the disc is probably best set to read/write to prevent its protection level being altered – perhaps to no access – by some small but smart person.

On Risc OS 3 many disc operations such as copying and formatting are multitasking, unlike Risc OS 2 where they tie up the whole machine. The multitasking features with

IdeA'92 are built in, so it won't tie up even a Risc OS 2 machine.

Prices for the various internal and external units are subject to change due to supply and demand on the world market – unfortunately it's even worse for the 2.5in IDE hard drive. You can expect to pay from £200 to £250 for a 20Mb drive, including VAT, while for the top range 80Mb it's £550 to £600. However, that's a lot of hard disc.

Although we've concentrated on the A3000 internal unit here, the IdeA'92 range includes external and internal drives for all the Acorn machines except the A4. The control software is not required for the A5000 as Acorn adopted the IDE hard drive as standard, so a second drive will cost less.

Other companies offer hard drives for the A3000 and, being hardware, they certainly work. However, the new ICS software currently seems to offer a very versatile solution.

HAVING a hard disc is nice enough, but it doesn't take long to discover that 2Mb of main memory is just not enough if you're playing with 40Mb worth of applications and data. So if you have an A5000 you could do worse than check the available easy memory upgrades.

Back in the bad old days of the A300 series, a home ram upgrade was not – and is not if you still have one – a task for the faint-hearted, involving as it does pulling the machine to pieces, extracting the ARM

chips, installing the upgrade and hoping there weren't any pieces left over when you'd got it back together.

Both the A400 series and A3000 had sockets for extra ram, and so it is with the A5000. The upgrade merely involves removing the lid, popping a board into a slot provided at the front next to the disc drive and adding one link. Perhaps 15 minutes if you take your time.

We tried the Leading Edge board and it was fine, but this type of *legal* upgrade is bound to conform to Acorn's standards and the limits of what the hardware itself can handle, so there's not much room for variety.

Still, while you've got the lid off, you could install a floptical – see the separate panel – or why not get a second hard drive?

THE old 8-bit BBC Micro had a lot of ports to the outside world – primarily the User Port and analogue inputs – that were not duplicated as standard on the 32-bit machines. Acorn did produce an expansion card that gave these plus an equivalent of the 1MHz bus, however this card is only of practical use to A300, A400, A500 and A5000 series owners.

But more A3000s are found in schools, where the missing ports are in fact of more value. To fill the gap Watford Electronics produced their own board – in two forms – which fits all the Risc OS machines apart from the A4.

These two units each provide the User Port and ADC – analogue to digital converters – while the A3000 version alone also has an I²C port, which was not available on the old BBC Micro. It offers a very economic method of extending the A3000's interfacing capabilities.

Installation of the unit is identical to that for the internal hard drive, and just as fiddly. In fact it sits in exactly the same place, so you can't have both. On the other hand since the most likely user is a school department it probably won't need a hard disc in the A3000.

The hardware provides a 6522 VIA chip, as found on the BBC Micro, which supports the User Port and a NEC uPD7002 ADC chip for the four analogue inputs. The I²C is an extension of the bus already existing in the A3000, and is used for communication with the clock.

The support software is designed to match Acorn's expansion card and the standard operating system calls *OS_Byte* and *FX* will yield exactly the same results on the 32-bit machines as *osbyte* and *FX* calls on the BBC Micro.

One SWI call – *IIC_Control* – for the I²C bus performs both read and write operations. A lot of relatively cheap hardware devices conform to the I²C protocol and it's just a matter of plugging them in to get readings, though you'd have to write the software yourself.

When speed is of the essence – and compatibility isn't – the BBC I/O board also provides a command so that you can find out its hardware address. From there, using the information provided in the manual, you can read and write to the ports directly.

Eight of the manual's 30 pages are devoted to installation. The instructions for the A3000 are very clear and accurate, which is just as well considering how tricky the task is.

There are concise descriptions of all the interface software commands and how they are used. Examples are few, but it's a fair

assumption that if you want this board you probably know what to do with it.

Of the three appendices, the first gives a detailed description of the hardware – useful if you want direct access to the chips – with illustrations of the socket connections. Unfortunately, although numbered, there is no indication from which side the sockets are being viewed. There is, however, a full description of the tolerances of each connection.

The second appendix details the differences between this unit and its BBC equivalent – pri-

marily the fact that the BBC I/O runs faster, which might make a difference. For most applications this should be an advantage.

The final appendix is a reference for appropriate data sheets, and the manual finishes with a very thorough, perhaps unnecessarily detailed, glossary – anyone using this card will certainly know most of the definitions.

All in all, this is a very nice unit with good compatibility with its forbears and considerably less expensive than its Acorn equivalent – especially with the A3000, where there is no competition.

Since Acorn went for IDE as the standard hard drive on the A5000 and A4 they opened the door for big – standard – expansions. Extra hard discs don't have to come with expansion cards and their own special filing systems.

This type of upgrade is classed as non-standard, which means that Acorn didn't make provision for a second hard disc in the location where the second floppy drive can go. This seems a silly mistake, because no one really needs two floppy drives when they have a hard disc.

The internal floptical also fits into this location, so you can't have both a second hard drive and an internal floptical. But then if you're rich enough to afford both – and the A5000 in the first place – you might as well get a SCSI interface and have *legal* add-ons instead.

Installing the second hard drive – we were provided with a 100Mb unit, with lots of space to expand into – was not easy. Or rather it was very fiddly and time consuming, while not actually being difficult.

The first stage involves opening up the A5000 and removing all your expansion cards, followed by disconnecting all the disc drives and removing the entire assembly of drives and backplane in one unit. A suitable crosshead screwdriver and a little oomph is all you need.

Then the hard disc is screwed on to the base plate (flathead screwdriver required, why can't people standardise?)

From there it's a matter of making this and that connection, unplugging bits and bobs and adding others.

Finally you get the backplane and drive assembly back in place after much pushing and positioning of ribbon cables and power leads. We found that the screw that holds the centre of the assembly in place just wouldn't go back – something was pushing the two holes it had to fit into, out of alignment.

Nothing immediately presented itself as being the cause and it didn't look too much of a problem so, eager to test it, we replaced the expansion cards, put the lid back on, reconnected everything and switched on. Result: Still only one hard drive icon.

No problem, we'd seen this situation before. Run the *!Configure* application, select the drives icon and increase the number of IDE drives by one. And reboot. Voilà, a second hard drive icon.

Next time, can somebody design one that simply mounts on the back of the first hard drive – then we can have a floptical as well?

Somewhere along the line some of my configure settings were changed and the *ADFSBuffers* option was set to a value other than zero. Now there's a known bug in the ADFS in Risc OS 3.00 that starts losing files and generally running amok if the buffers value isn't zero.

Having just installed the second hard disc, and with this error creeping in, we began to suspect that something was seriously wrong with the hard disc.

However we eventually noticed that *ADFSBuffers* was non-zero, so a quick:

*Con.ADFSBuffers 0

and *Control+Break* reset the safe setting and suddenly all was running smoothly again. So if you find a similar problem you know what to look for.

Floptical drives: Here today, gone tomorrow?

BEFORE we get into the types of floptical drive it's probably a good idea to take a good look at what a floptical – somebody somewhere must be proud of that name – actually is.

The name is derived from floppy and optical, the floppy part referring to the fact that the disc is a standard 3.5in size and the doughnut – the bit inside the casing – is flexible. Optical refers to the way that the tracks are located on the disc itself.

In a normal disc drive the read/write head is positioned mechanically, being driven back and forwards to positions relative to track zero. This places a limitation on the accuracy of the

positioning and hence the maximum number of tracks that can be put on the disc.

In the PC world, where there is the constant commercial thrust towards *more* and *better* but cheaper, the disc capacity went from 40 track to 80 track to 80 track double-sided, which gave 720k of storage. Acorn's 80 track double-sided format gave 640k originally which went up to 800k with the 32-bit machines.

The PC market jumped again by doubling the amount stored on each track taking them to 1.44Mb. Acorn used the same technique to go up to 1.6Mb. This is now the standard, and although technology for higher densities exists there's no real standardisation. In the

Adding some joy



Anyone who has played a maze-type adventure game with the keyboard controls will at times feel the need for quicker reactions or an extra hand.

And what simulator freak at times has not wanted to abandon the key-presses for a control mechanism just like the real thing?

As Acorn machines were not built with games as their primary market, they have no dedicated joystick support, but Jersey-based RTFM as well as Leading Edge have plugged this breach. Other companies plan similar devices.

However, one very interesting development is that over the last six months Acorn have issued a standard for joystick modules, which means that you can now treat your joystick and interface in a similar way to a printer, with the dedicated software acting as a printer driver.

Some games come with RTFM or Serial Port (aka The Leading Edge) modules, but if your joystick does not have a module on the game disc then all you'll have to do is load the

software for your interface disc. There may be some problems with older games which don't comply to this standard.

The hardware consists of a device which plugs into the printer port of any Archimedes. You can then plug in one or two joysticks in the 9-pin D sockets. You can still use the printer which daisychains on to the other side with a manual switch to activate the joystick or printer as necessary.

If you also have a dongle for Impression, Artworks and so on, the collection does look a little precarious. Luckily Vertical Twist – who designed the interface – have thought about this and there is an optional extra cable which allows you to put the box of tricks in a less hazardous position.

The comprehensive manual does warn that the joystick interface may interfere with dongle protected software, and my copy of Impression

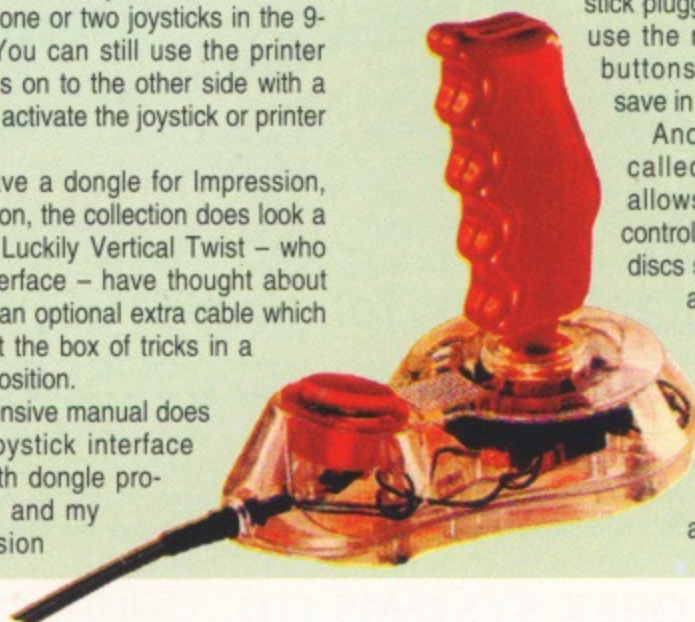
refused to recognise the hardware key unless I rebooted the machine.

On the software side, Leading Edge have put together a very nice package of programs which are given good support by the documentation. Most major new games come with the modules you need, so you load the specific module then play the game.

But what if you have got an old game or a game without a joystick option? Very simply, first look in the Start directory to see if there is a module already prepared, if not then load up JS_Tutor. For instance, the new game Cascade uses Z, X, ' / and Return. To create a module for my joystick move the joystick right and press Z and so on.

You don't need to have the joystick plugged in, as you can use the mouse and radio buttons. You can then save in the usual way.

Another application called JS_AddMod allows you to add the control module to games discs so that it is loaded automatically when you play. It can be used with old style games with !Boot files, but don't add this to an original games





PC market you can get 2.88Mb, or even 12Mb on a system designed by NEC.

However, these all use basically the same mechanism of a magnetic coating on a disc and a read/write head that's positioned relative to its starting position – the NEC drive actually contains positional information between the data tracks.

Clearly it was time for a re-think, and it was probably CDs that provided the initial idea for the system devised by InSite Peripherals. In a CD the data is read using a laser, but the position of the head is controlled by data read off the disc.

With the new method the read/write head

also has an optical sensor attached to it and the disc – which is transparent – has servo tracks etched in at production time. The head is guided by its optical sensor watching the servo tracks. This type of disc has 759 tracks with a total storage capacity of more than 20Mb.

It was also decided at the design stage that a single standard interface would be used for communication with the outside world. Clearly InSite wanted their system to be easily connected to as many different computer systems as they could, so they chose SCSI and

all floptical drives use that interface.

So what use is a 20Mb disc? It's great for backing up hard discs – just two discs needed for a 40Mb one, only five needed for a 100Mb, even a file server with 200Mb will need only 10 discs, and that's assuming no compression is applied.

If you were transferring large files between machines over a long distance this would be a good medium to utilise. But at present dropping one of these discs on to a hard surface can render it unreadable, so it's unlikely to replace the standard 1.6Mb floppy as the common currency of disc usage.

One important feature of the floptical drive is



disc as this could lead to problems. Rather save it to a hard disc or a working disc copy if the game allows it – otherwise save it to your Start directory.

For more complex command structure JS_Comp, JS_Test, Key_Test and the Joystick Programming Language will help. These programs are used to instruct – test and debug – JS_Comp in a textfile to translate joystick movements into key presses or mouse movements.

For instance, should the game instruct you to press the spacebar to kick and the return key to punch, your basic five movements on a joystick will not be enough. However, by using the simple language program you can press both fire buttons to simulate pressing return and either fire button to press the spacebar and so on.

Push, pull and fire

The choice of joysticks is wide. The more traditional style is a simple stick with two fire buttons, one for the right handed and one for the left, which will give all the options needed. Others are much more elaborate, especially those built to complement flight simulators.

The more bits and bobs it offers, in general the more expensive a joystick will be. Of the ones we tried we found some problems with the **Aviator I** £34.99 from QuickShot (081- 365 1993) which sticks to your table with suction cups and the whole stick moves backwards and forwards to simulate a flight control stick – but all we could achieve was left and right.

The Stealth £14.95 from Ktron (0685 722509) is built in a crescent shape with one of the handgrips moved in a variety of ways to alter direction. This takes some getting used to, and I would certainly recommend some time spent with Leading Edge's JS_Test program before you even consider playing anything.

Also from QuickShot is the **Intruder I** priced at £29.95. Not a subtle piece of plastic, especially with the flip up fire button cover – although there is another fire button under the grip. This handgrip model does give good control and surprisingly precise control on screen, although some of the levers are really only for show.

The **Zipstik SuperPro** from Power Play (0457 876705) is a traditional style unit and has been available for some time for the BBC B. It will take a lot of hammering, is easy to manoeuvre with a good all over action. Priced at £13.99 it compares well to others in that range. The pastel coloured **Multi-Colour**

Cruiser is only £10.99 and is just as robust with a steel shaft and a more modern styling.

For people who prefer a single fire button option and a handgrip, the **Sureshot Standard** is again only £10.99. I prefer the **Cruiser** as I find it a more comfortable fit, although for solid input when playing a flight simulator £24 will buy you the **Delta-Cat** from Watford Electronics (0923 237774) ideal for seat-of-the-pants flying.

Hints and tips

As a rule of thumb opt for a joystick recommended for the Atari ST or Amiga, but if price is a consideration avoid rapid firing options or chose one that can be switched on or off, as these won't always work with the Archimedes interfaces.

The type of game you'll be playing should also effect your choice. Shoot'em-ups don't need particularly fine control, while with some arcade adventures you'll need to move one pixel at a time.

The style you finally choose – pistol grips, traditional or stylised – is in the end down to personal preference. However, if possible try one out see if you feel happy with the movement, if the base is heavy enough, the construction ready to take a bashing and so on.

Also don't forget that with some games you'll need two – or maybe more.



that it has been designed to read and write to normal floppy discs as well. So a single drive machine could have a floptical drive which would deal with 1.6Mb discs as well as the 20Mb ones.

However, because the development market is so oriented towards the PC, a problem arose. A disc track is divided into numbered sectors, with the numbering starting from one on a PC, but on Acorn's systems the first sector of a track is zero. The requirement to start from sector one has been programmed into the controlling software – firmware – that sits inside the floptical drive.

Now Acorn has requested that a change be made to the floptical firmware so that Acorn's own format can be used with a floptical disc.

Approaches

So how would you go about connecting a floptical to your system? Two approaches are available, the industry-standard SCSI method or the Acorn-specific *Econet SCSI* add-on.

Morley Electronics will supply an external or internal floptical disc drive with SCSI interface, this just daisy-chains on to the existing SCSI system if you have one. It appears on the icon bar when you switch on as just another disc drive.

Of the two approaches, the standard SCSI is the more expensive, but normally this would be offset by the fact that it doesn't use any additional expansion sockets on the machine, just one for the original SCSI interface board.

Unfortunately the other, non-standard, method of connecting a floptical doesn't use an expansion card socket anyway it uses the Econet port.

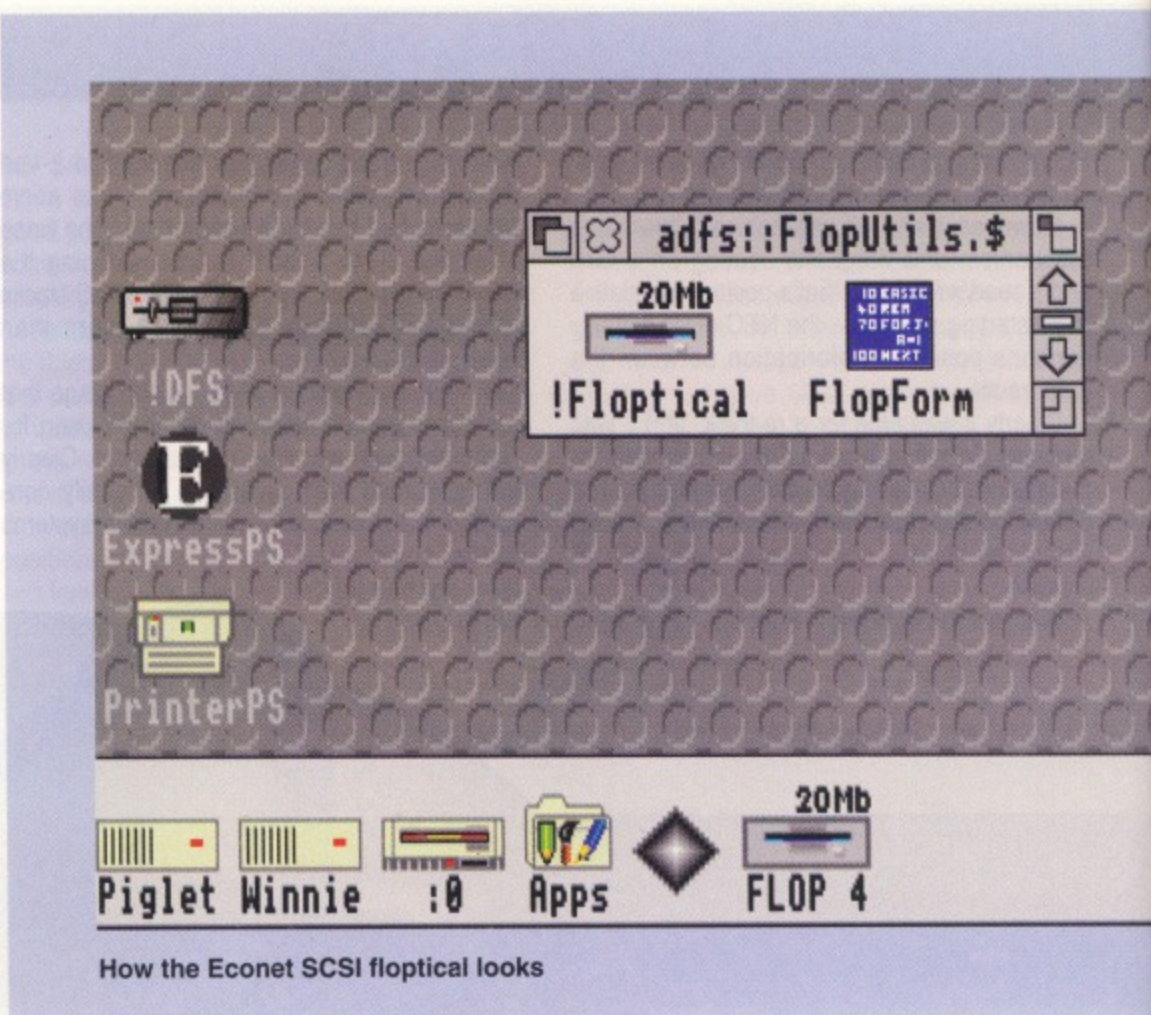
But if you're on a network or prefer to extend by normal SCSI anyway this is certainly the best route to take. Additionally there are a number of other products – apart from Econet itself – that use this port, so you may be constrained to go for the standard system.

Using Econet

It's a certainty that when Acorn created the Econet socket on their 32-bit machines they never envisioned the strange uses to which it would be put by people who aren't connected to a network.

For the floptical system from Desktop Projects you have the option of internal – for A5000 only – or external mounting. The internal system uses the A5000's power supply and fits underneath the existing 3.5in drive. The external has its own power unit.

The control board, about 2in square, carries just two chips, and plugs into the Econet interface socket. The drive lead then plugs into a socket on this board. With a standard SCSI system the driver software is held on an eprom

on the main SCSI board and is downloaded at switch on. This is exactly the same as with the CD-Rom system.

However with the Econet-based SCSI interface there's no way to load software from an eprom, so it has to be loaded separately from another disc – perhaps automatically from a hard disc boot file. This may seem a disadvantage but in practice it's no more of a problem than, say, loading up a utility to read and write PC discs.

The system itself merges perfectly with the Filer as you would expect, so all the operations are carried out as normal as far as dragging, double-clicking and so on.

Standard SCSI

The Morley floptical system is based on their SCSI interface card, and new versions now come with both CD-Rom and Floptical driver software on board as standard. When you buy any of their SCSI products you also get the interface card free – not a bad deal.

What you get is the floptical drive housed in a metal box which includes the power supply, there's a nice long SCSI cable and the SCSI card itself.

Fitting is just the same as with any other expansion card: Open up the machine, plug in the card, screw it in place and close up. Plug in the floptical, switch on the drive and the machine and there it is.

The software detects whether a drive is

connected and only appears on the icon bar if there is one – the same applies with CD-Roms.

Futures

The question arises as to whether the floptical really has a future. Many formats have come and gone, raising barely a flicker on the consciousness of computer users. In the PC market it has some potential, with products appearing that require 12 or more 720k floppies to hold the software which then has to be installed on to a hard disc. Such programs could easily fit on one floptical, and could be installed in a fraction of the time.

But the Acorn market is different. The whole Impression package comes on five discs, but the main program will run straight off the floppy and only occupies about 500k. Most other major programs occupy less space than this.

Some applications may require a portable 20Mb between physical locations, but they aren't common. Flopticals may not be as short lived as some concepts but it's doubtful if they'll become very common.

Much more likely to become widespread are the new breed of hard discs that – using the floptical technique of optical positioning – can store 5.5Gigabytes on a 3.5in unit, and 1Gb is 1,024Mb. Such a drive can hold over 7,000 times as much as an 800k floppy. It's hardly comprehensible is it?

THE DRIVING FORCE

Winner of the Best Printer in the recent Computer Shopper Awards, the Cannon BJ10ex printer has revolutionised the small printer market. Computer Concepts have now created a set of RISC OS printer drivers, called TurboDrivers, that are optimised for the Cannon BJ10ex printer. The result is the perfect combination of budget printer and RISC OS printer driver, able to print full 360 dpi high resolution pages at a quality superior to that available from any dot matrix printer.

The TurboDrivers not only print the pages faster, but give control back sooner - up to ten times quicker. The table shows the time taken to print and the time the computer is occupied for some typical example pages.

The TurboDrivers print faster on an ARM2 machine than traditional drivers on an ARM3 machine. In addition they can send the print data to disc and then print from disc in the background, so the computer and almost all memory remains free for other uses, while the printer gets on with printing.

FOR those who have not come across a datalogger, it is a basically a device which records voltages against time. The advantage of this method of recording data from sensors is that it is compact and runs off batteries, so can be used in remote locations for measuring experiments. Also it does not tie up the computer for long periods of time.

LogIT

The LogIT fits into a small carrying case with the cables and other sensor attachments. A link pack connects this to the host computer, with the relevant software on disc. It measures a mere 120 x 67 x 32mm, so you can easily pop it in your pocket and a power supply, battery charger with a fully charged battery come as standard.

The DCP bus socket is a technical expansion port. This lets you expand the LogIT to control and monitor other devices such as SwitchIT and the DAC pack which is a 1 micro-second 8-bit digital to analogue converter.

The link socket has two functions: The first is to communicate with the host computer. However the socket can be used for I²C control bus which is available on the Archimedes.

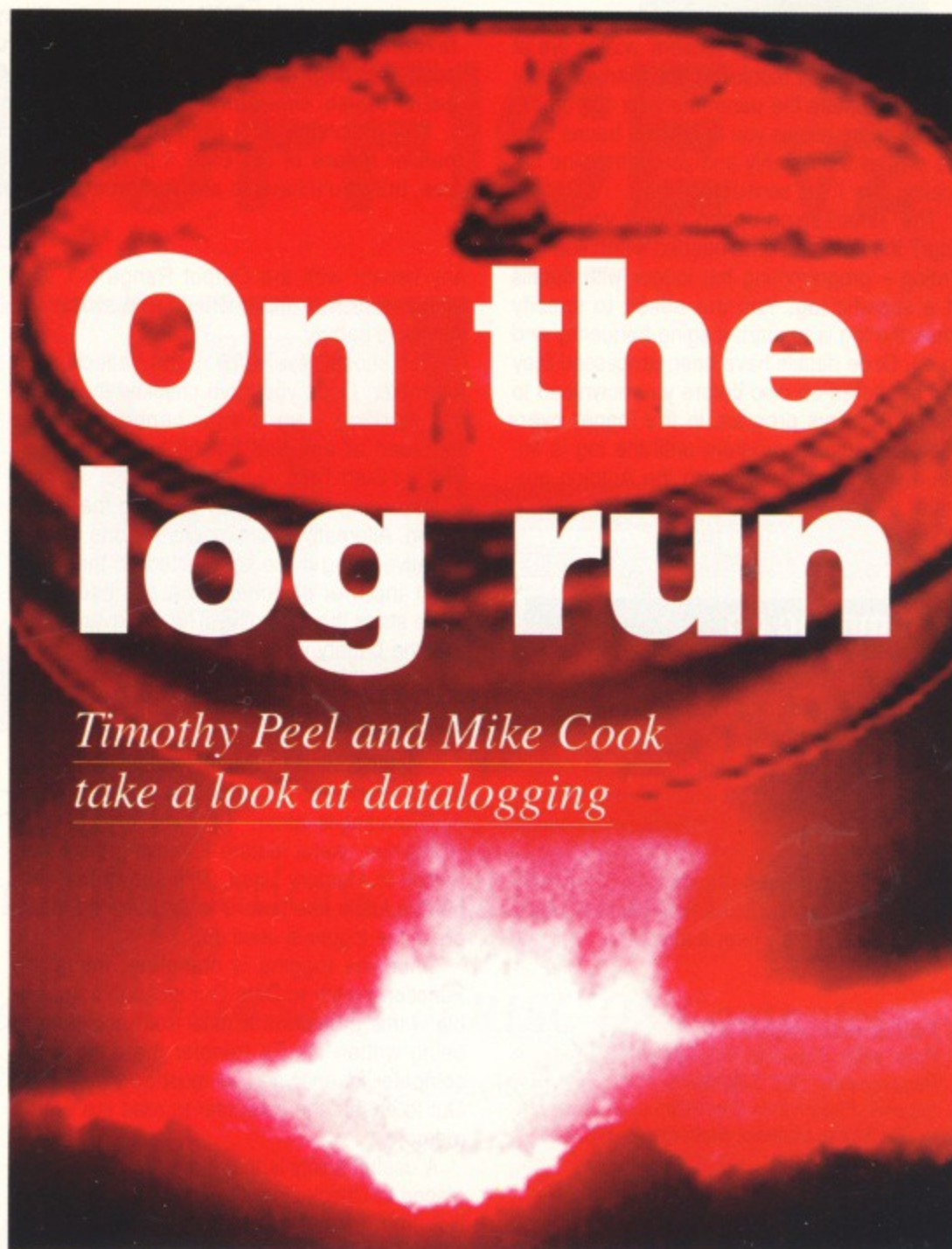
The remaining sockets are the sensor ports. These are DIN-type and where necessary they also provide the power for the sensors. The beauty of this machine is it knows what each sensor is and its calibration range which makes the machine easier to operate.

The LogIT has two sensors: Light level and temperature. The light level sensor is calibrated in a 0-100 per cent operating range – the advantage being you are not fixed to a specific range.

Its filters allow the range to be adjusted and the device is sensitive to a wide spectrum of colour including infrared. The temperature sensor is designed to measure air, surface or liquids in the range of -20 to +70 degrees C.

The sensor is waterproof and has a resolution of 0.1 degree C, with other sensors include pH, heart rate counter, speed, voltage and so on as well as one for Philip Harris probes.

The LogIT needs to be linked to an Archimedes and the software allows you to check battery status and sensors outputs. If you wish to leave a record of specific events, you can mark the data by pressing the green

button twice. An event mark is represented on the plot of the data as an arrow at the top of the graph. You can log up to four experiments before downloading the data.

Alternatively you can tell LogIT to record at a specific time or rate by downloading the details from the host computer. You specify a start and recording time as well as the time and date. The machine starts to interweave data once the initial memory has been used up.

The longer the experiment the slower the sampling rate, which obviously means that on long experiments the resolution of readings is lost. Should something happen that you didn't expect you won't have the resolution of data to analyse what happened.

Software

The computer cable connects the link socket of the LogIT to the analogue port on the host computer. The system works at two levels of

manual – the *paper* manual and the *electronic* manual – one on paper and one on-line accessed via the ? key.

The software presents you with a variety of options: As It Happens allows you to check the status of the battery and the sensors output in bar chart form. This is useful since you can check that LogIT is ready.

You can then do a *live* log where the computer produces a live plot of what the logger is measuring. This is automatically scaled on the vertical since the sensor's range is known and the horizontal time axis has an initial scaling of four minutes which is doubled to eight on reaching four minutes and so on. This gives a continuous display of results with diminishing resolution.

The results are not stored unless it was logging at the time, since you are simply using the logger as an interface to the computer. But these are retained in the computer memory so that you can plot and analyse them.

Standard Zoom functions are available, with



Conclusions

The approach taken in the design of these data loggers is different. The LogIT concentrates in maximising software control and building in *intelligence* to its sampling rate. On the other hand the EMU relies on traditional switches knobs and meters, an approach favoured by those who are reluctant to trust the software. The EMU has more storage space for data 2k as opposed to LogIT's 240 readings per sensor. However, the LogIT is easier to use, especially if used with its own sensors.

The problems with long period logging with the LogIT must be weighted against the bulkier nature of the EMU. I personally favour the LogIT since it is compact and easy to use, but you'll have to assess your own needs and make your own decisions.

Auto Zoom where each sensors' scales are at maximum display resolution and Marked Zoom where you state the parameters for the graph. The software allows you to remove traces from the display temporarily and you can define the scaling of a 1 volt sensor too.

The Time/Timing option allows you to tell LogIT the time and date needed when you use Prolog – programming the logger with details of a specific log. You are asked to specify when the log is to start, logging frequency and so on. Once details have been processed they can be stored on disc before you download to the LogIT. This program in the logger overrides the Autolog program until the log is finished when LogIT reverts to the Autolog program.

Summing up

The LogIT is versatile and allows you to obtain good results. The only problem is when the machine is on long logging sessions resolution is lost. If the logger could use all four channels for such an experiment or one sensor was used, the resolution could be improved.

Overall it is a good machine for short logging periods but lacks the facilities to allow it to record accurately over a long time.

EMU datalogger

The Easy Memory Unit comes with a lead for charging the internal rechargeable battery and one for connecting to the analogue port of the Model B or Master.

The unit can be battery or mains operated. One useful tip is to log with the power supply connected which charges the battery at the same time. On long logging time periods, you can switch the logger off and it will switch to its internal circuits 15ms before the next reading is due. This conserves the battery – you are not really turning the logger off but putting it into a low power mode.

The first thing to do is to clear the memory of all previous data. Setting the record rate switch allows sampling to occur, from 3,000 items a second to 0.1 readings a minute with a reading every 10 minutes. There are 10 different rates on the switch and a further slide switch lets you specify per second or per minute.

Once the rate is set, you can check that the sensors are working. The device can work with

any sensor with the Output Range 0-1 volt. Firstly, switch to Input Check and switch the sensor to battery.

This should give a full 1 volt deflection on the meter. Once you have checked the inputs are working – up to four sensors can be recorded at any one time – you switch the EMU to Start Test.

Recording is started by pushing the Reset button. Alternatively the machine starts when a negative-going pulse is detected on the channel 1 input or switched so a positive-going pulse starts the recording. The disadvantage is that the battery will run flat in about six hours, as the machine is fully primed.

Now start the machine and the meter will show that data is being logged by switching the Meter Switch to Each Reading where the meter needle moves from 0 to 9 and back as each reading is taken.

Another useful feature is moving the Meter Switch to Memory Used. This shows the needle gradually rise from 0 to 9/10 as the memory of the logger is used up.

Once the logging is complete, move the Function switch to Data Out as soon as possible – this protects the data from accidentally being written on. To transfer the data to the computer for analysis you must switch on Data Out to enable the computer to read the EMU's memory.

A useful facility is that if the Meter Switch is placed in Check Data Out mode the meter will flick from a reading of 10 to 0, then return to 10 again. This lets you know that the EMU's memory has been read.

The EMU reads the channels from 1 to 4 which means a fastest recording speed of 3,000 readings per second. If you join all four together you'll get a reading rate of 12,000. When you'd use such a speed is open to question, but possibly to measure the speed of sound or the acceleration of an object due to gravity.

At lower rates this facility breaks down, since the delay time between reading input 1 and 2 is constant regardless of recording rate, whereas the time between reading 4 and 1 changes. One very useful option is the facility to pause the EMU and change the recording rate.

Software

The EMU comes with a simplified version of Datadisc Plus which downloads and allows some manipulation of the data.

You'll probably need to calibrate the channels before the data is downloaded, as once

it's loaded you are trapped with the default calibration range of 0-1 volt.

The calibration menu lets you set up the sensors in several ways. Once you have requested the transfer of data you are prompted for the recording rate and for the memory format to use – the safest option is to use the All instruction.

After setting the EMU to Data Out the information downloads into memory. A plot of the data is drawn on screen and you have a wealth of graph manipulation at your fingertips. Useful facilities include adjusting the axes, plotting only one channel, X-Y plotting, printing and zooming.

After you have looked at your data and decided to save it, you'll find that you will have files with strange letters after the name. If you had four inputs of data on the EMU, after downloading and saving you will have four files with the filename you saved the data under with different last letters.

For instance, if all your data was saved under the name *physics*, when you look at the data files on disc you will have *physics.a*, *physics.b*, *physics.c* and *physics.d*.

You will also have a *physics.e* file which contains the description of what the *physics* data files are about. Once you have given the computer a filename you can write a description of who produced the data.

Obviously the software allows you to save and load data from disc and when loading you have quick key facilities as well as the other methods of calling up a file.

Summing up

The excellent facilities of Datadisc Plus with the EMU allow the removal or addition of points and you can use the function keys to flick in/out data plot.

This is very useful when you want to remove a single channel's data quickly.

A utilities menu calculates related data, adds it from another file, smooths it and it has the facility to draw a straight line out of the data – you can achieve funny results with this.

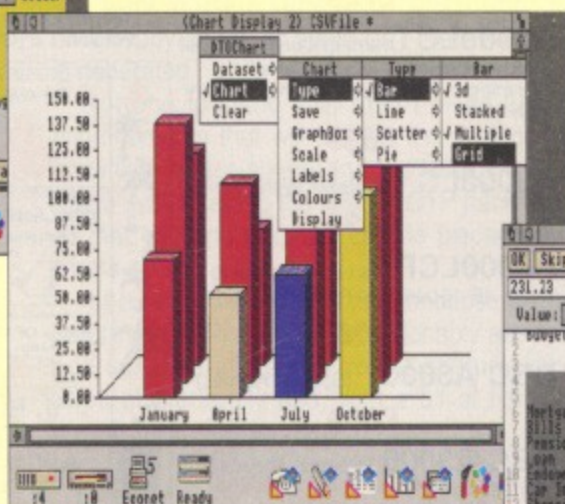
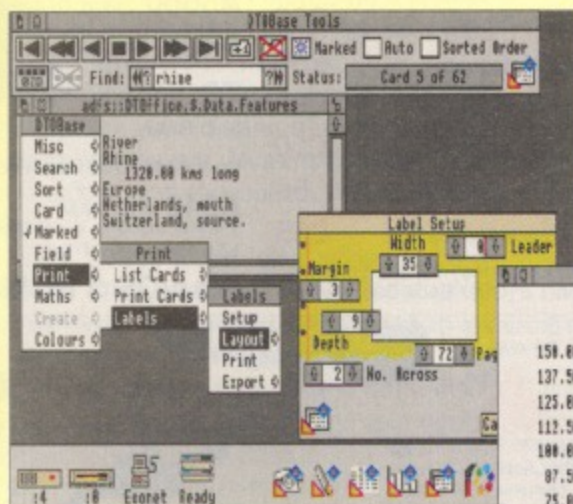
One point I disliked is that if you tell the computer the wrong information about the recording rate, not only is the time axis wrong but it also makes a dog's dinner of scaling the units.

I'd have liked the EMU to tell the host computer what the recording rate was. That point aside, I found it easy to use, with very few problems, particularly with the Datadisc Plus software.

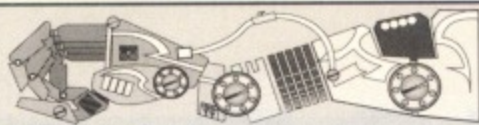

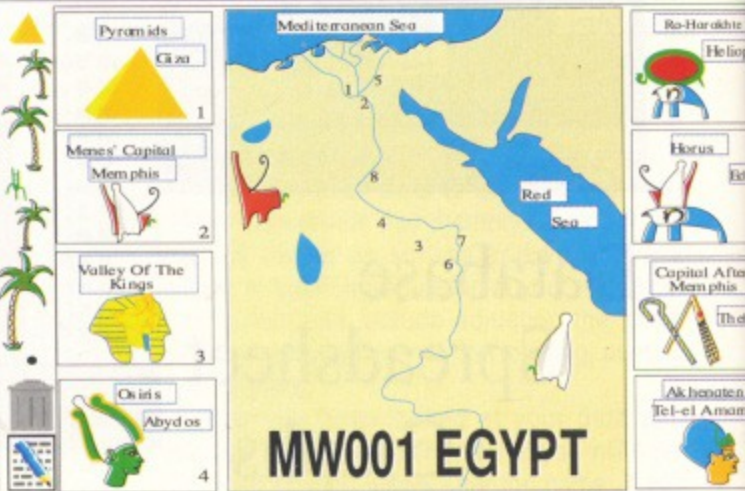

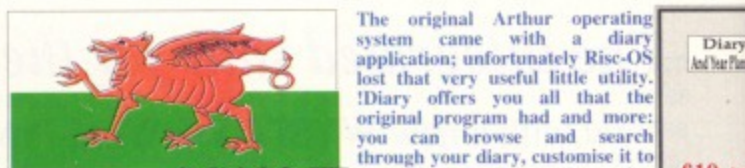

LEAVING music and even sprites behind to some extent, this month we'll look at the most powerful part of human communication – the word.

Whether spoken or written, if you can't convey your meaning to others your message is irrelevant. Music and art can convey emotions and atmosphere but won't help at Asda.

I have always found letter writing to be a chore, so I took to Stuart Tyrrell's letter utility straight away. **LetterView** is designed to let you send original and highly personalised letters. You can include sprites in the text without having to resort to a DTP package and manipulate text reasonably well too.

You could use simple text files for your mis- sives but LetterView, with its envelope icon, is much more eye-catching. Double-clicking it loads text, graphics and all into a single, scroll- able window.

To compose your *billet du* all you need is Edit – which comes as standard on the Applications disc – as you'll have to amend the file named Letter with your sprites and words.

With Shift held down double-click on the LetterView icon to reveal the Edit file which will hold your letter. Purple prose can be justified left, right or centred and sprites can be treated exactly the same. As everything takes place in the usual window environment all the normal rules apply.

Although at present you will only be able to use sprite files, PD and commercial programs are out there to convert drawfiles into sprite- files. With the quantity of clip art around you can put together some very interesting letters.

Compose your thoughts in Edit and add some codes to make the text more interesting. To centre a line of text, start the line with #C, followed by your text while the right justify code is #R and so on.

Sprites can also be placed in the text, so if

you wanted to centre a sprite you'd enter:

```
#SC<LetterView$dir>.Filename of sprite file
Name of sprite
```

Once finished you should have your text in the Letter file and your sprites saved within the directory as well. You could specify sprites on the recipient's hard disc – especially useful if you want to use a large sprite which won't fit on a floppy, but if the sprite isn't there an error is generated.

Not one to stand still, Stuart plans future improvements that will include the addition of drawfiles, better speed and the addition of a frame system along the lines of DTP packages so that text and graphics can be placed any- where.

It's a neat little program and, because of the nature of the Risc OS, it is reasonably easy to add scanned images of your signature, pic- tures of the family and, with a bit of fiddling

with sprites, different text effects. Moreover, you can pat yourself on the back for saving a tree or two.

Busby on the wire

Dave Walsh has been busy using Helix Basic to produce a very nice array of programs. First there's **Call Coster** which calculates the cost of your telephone calls at any time of the day, reading the Archimedes internal clock to deter- mine the current rate. Handy if you prefer the spoken to the written word.

A log is available after the first call which records the start time, band, length and cost. At the end of the day you can be horrified by just how much you've spent. Once the timer has started you can't change the band so make sure that you select the one you want first.

As Dave is an IT adviser it is not surprising that his other two programs have a decided education bias – although they score high on entertainment value too. **Quiz** is a multi-task-

ing multiple-choice package written for a group of schools in East Kent. A number of files are available covering general knowledge, theatre and pop but the best part of this program is that you can add your own questions in any wordprocessor that saves text in Ascii. Full step-by-step details are given for the inexperienced.

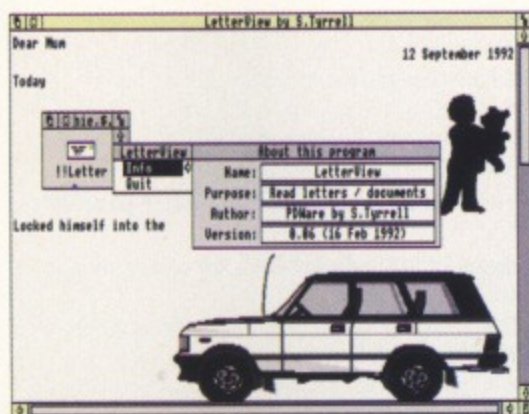

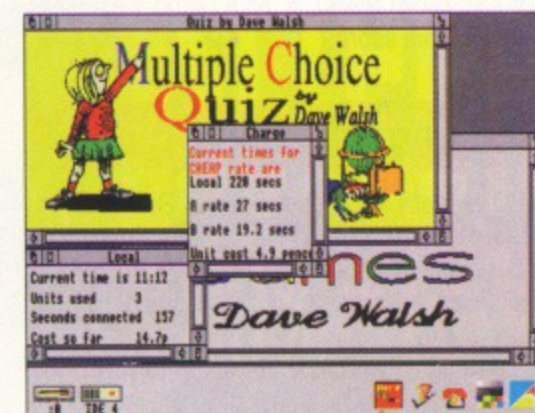
and load !HelixSys – the PD module of Helix Basic – before you try to load these programs. Then everything works in the usual way from the iconbar.

Scoring is automatic and you can see how you're doing from the iconbar menu. You can start at specific questions too if you don't want a long session.

► **Wordgames.** This is basically a range of games which aim to develop skills associated with reading.

It consists of three separate programs that have been combined into one – Word Shape, Anagram and Shannon's Game. A scoring facility adds a little arcade interest rather than plain old drill and practice.

Word Shape demands that you guess the words being displayed by their shape. The screen shows all the possible words as well as the shape which is selected randomly. Choose the word by clicking on letters in the letter window which are presented in an easy to read handwriting-type font.

Anagram displays a word as – you've guessed it – an anagram. You enter the letters in the same way and the chosen word has its letters mixed up. Short words have a higher chance of being displayed as they should be spelt. In this case the word would just need to be copied.

Shannon's Game aims to improve spelling by reinforcing the rules of spelling in any language. This game has a feel of Hangman but the letters must be guessed in order. The screen shows the file name as well as the length of the word.

As with Quiz you can add your own words using Edit or Ascii files from other wordprocessors or computers by creating files of words with no spaces at the end. The file must have a carriage return after the last word in the file. Files can be as long as you want but Word Shape and Anagram will only load the first 15 words under 12 characters.

Scrabble for words

LC Howe from Romford in Essex was spurred into action by a letter in our July issue about a Scrabble game for the Archimedes. Mike Chappel from Clacton, who wanted to play that famous word game, to oblige Mr Howe has sent his excellent version.

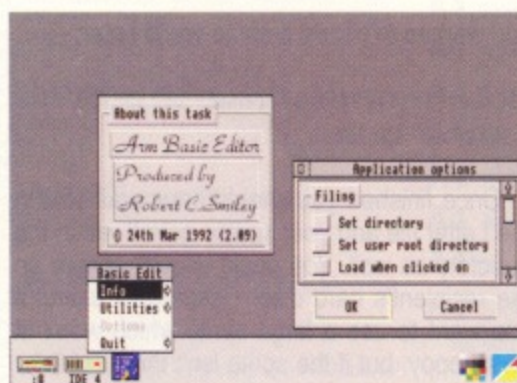
Sword has been tested quite thoroughly and there is a huge dictionary of over 34,000 words with search facilities – I just wish I knew what some of them meant.

The juggling, browsing and searching is supposed to give you a chance against an omnipotent Archimedes. You can opt to have up to four players, human or computer – I still got stuck with the Q, Y and Z and we'll gloss over the final score.

Editing the basics

MPD recently sent me a copy of Rob Smiley's **!BasicEdit**. There are a few Basic editors around, so what does this one do? For a start it includes a file coder, a space stripper and a Basic printer.

Loading a Basic file is straightforward and you have the ability to just drag the icon on to the application on the icon bar. If you prefer

you could select the auto-run option in the application menu and double-click on the file icon.

While this option is selected two other features can be used. Holding down Shift and double-clicking on the file icon runs the file instead of loading it into the Basic editor, while Shift+Alt+double-clicking on the file icon loads it into Basic but not the editor. If you prefer you can always use Shift and click on the icon to

enter Basic without accessing the Basic editor.

Don't panic if you want to return to the Desktop – hold down Shift and Ctrl and press F4. There are two ways to re-enter the Desktop from Basic – F5 or type QUIT and press Return.

Writing or editing your program is then up to you but you'll need to run it sometime by holding down Shift, Ctrl and F12 or press F11. You can pop back into the program by pressing Print.

The built-in file coder can be accessed via the applications menu. Then drag the file that is to be coded on to the application icon. From the menu move the pointer across the arrow beside the Code file option. A window will be opened to save the code. The two radio icons on the right of the window let you determine if the code has a Basic file type or not.

The print option has a No Indent option which removes all indents from files loaded into the editor – a nice time-saving feature. All in all it is a very useful and nicely put together program.

...flyboy fever

LOST in space you have wandered on to the solar jet stream and into the Azran solar system on the outer spiral arm of the Megellonian galaxy – slightly more thrilling than taking the wrong turn on the M25.

There is no Dr Smith, no robot and no family to keep you company. Totally on your own you must cross the system on the Orbit Express to escape.

The entire system was formerly a penal colony with all lifeforms living underground in huge caverns hewn from the rock by convict labour. Now it's home to a thriving economy that expanded after Blackhole Monday wiped out the galactic economy.

The interplanetary transport craft is manned by frightfully polite but mercenary captains who won't let you on without the price of a ticket. This leaves you with just two choices: Stay and live with Azzies, or earn your passage by collecting gold from the caverns.

Guile combines elements used successfully over the years: 3D vector graphics, trad-

ing and piloting your spaceship past hurdles and obstacles from pterodactyls – found on Hermhaeven, the deserted movie set planet – to stalactites testing your expertise and panache.

In an amazingly addictive amalgam of Zarch, Elite and Thrust, Guile, written by Andrew Martin, the author of Air Supremacy, puts you at the controls of a craft that handles like a dream once you sort out the control system. The mouse gives the best results and when you get the hang of the movement it is – relatively – plain sailing.

You must pilot the CV2000 through a maze of underground adventures. But you can't take all day: The interplanetary ships leave to schedule and you have a time limit to find goods with which to trade – successfully – to buy the passage one step closer to your nearest and dearest.

The prose which greets your successes and failures is atmospheric and doesn't take itself too seriously with just the right injection of humour and puns.

You start with a basic amount of money and a ship parked on the teleport dock. By flying north you pass through caverns and tunnels that curve and arch. Here and there are trees, bushes and rocks plus whole expanses of water –



watch out for the water spouts. In the first cavern there's one bar of gold and one gem but there's no point trying to beam them into the ship just yet.

Travelling on you finally reach the end and another teleport station. Landing – you don't have to be too neat about it – you switch to trading mode in which you can buy a unit that will hold the altitude you set – essential for gold collection.

Lots of other goodies are on offer: Weapons, loads of fuel, shield restoring and so on. Then it's back into the cavern to get that gold – just hang over it and get down close then a long press of the Tab key will beam it up, Scotty. Then it's back to the teleport station to trade it in for more money.

Pretty simple? Well not quite, sometimes caverns barely taller than your ship are filled with stalactites and stalagmites that you have to negotiate. Tunnels are scarcely wide enough but descend so rapidly that it takes an ace to negotiate them properly. Then there are the other



ships, doors across the tunnels and flying rocks to name a few.

Though not specifically a combat game, there are things to shoot at – like trees blocking a tunnel and vigilantes who don't like the cut of your jib.

The early tunnels are just single ones in a straight line, but further on you'll find cross tunnels – then your compass comes into its own.

Guile uses the laws of physics thoroughly: Every time you pick up gold your ship gets heavier and uses more fuel. Some planets have a much higher gravity and some a lot less – and you'll need gold for ballast.

This isn't a game for the timid but if you want to try something that's a bit out of the ordinary, this is definitely for you.

ANOTHER excellent selection of games for the summer comes from Superior this month under the Sam heading. So much code is squeezed into this release that no tape option is available. All these games have been seen before, and emphasis is on sport with Summer Olympiad and Master Break on the menu.

The now defunct Tynesoft produced some truly excellent games and though Summer Olympiad is not one of my all-time favourites its value for money cannot be overstated. There are five events to play and they are not the over-televised over-hyped sports which you may well have had your fill of recently.

All events have three rounds and Fencing is first. The scoring is simple: The first player to score three hits in a bout wins with the keyboard controlling the movement, ripostes, parries and lunges.

The Triple Jump follows and this is my favourite and the trickiest to get just right. The Z and X keys must be pounded to get a good run up, only pressing the spacebar when you reach the white bar – too far and it's a foul jump. You now move to control the angle of your hop, skip and jump and to gain a medal – hopefully.

Skeet shooting is not a sport I have come across before but it is very similar to clay pigeon shooting. Although a nice point is that in a tie the person with the most ammunition left wins. Again there are three rounds and you have 24 moving targets to hit.

Moving from field to track events you are presented with the Hurdles. Timing is essential in the real life event as well as the computer simulation and the secret of success is getting the right rhythm.

The questions are very nicely put together and are a challenge to an individual or a group and with

foul shots and time limits to keep you on your toes you'd better get into training immediately.

Tactic is new to the BBC being written by Andrew Pepperell for French software house Eterna and converted from the Archimedes version. It's a simple one or two-player matching game which can drive even normally sane people to the status of gibbering wrecks.

Basically, different coloured balls and blocks come on to the screen. Underneath is a key or

shapes these can be formed into: 3-object straight lines, crosses and squares.

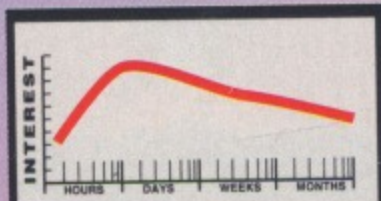
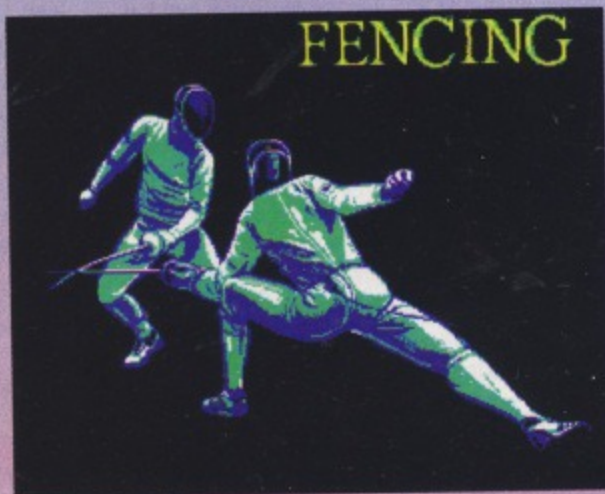
All you have to do is match the number and types of patterns required with the objects falling on screen using left and right keys. Luckily there is a pause option so that you can gather your thoughts and later levels are passworded.

Last but not least is the classic Video's Revenge which has been around for many years. Yet it is just the thing to let you vent your frustration after failing a dive, irritation with a nasty science questions or fury at an illusive square out on an inanimate animated alien.

It's a shoot-'em up where you can move up, down, left and right as you scroll up the screen illuminating each wave before they mutate. The further you get the more furious the opposition becomes and the more necessary the smart bombs and cloaking device. Watch out for energy pods, bonuses and sneaky nasties. Use the Force.

So how does this compilation compare with others in the series? It's balanced, excellent value for money with something for everyone – what else could you want?

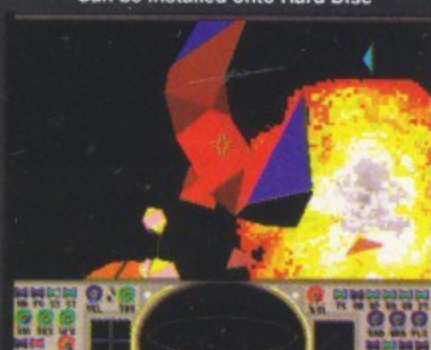

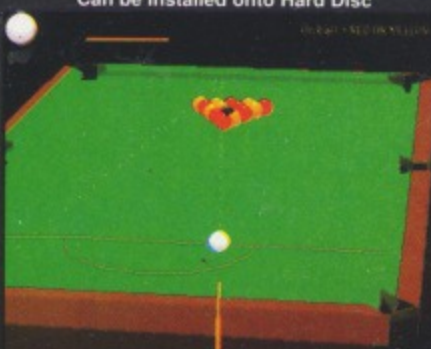

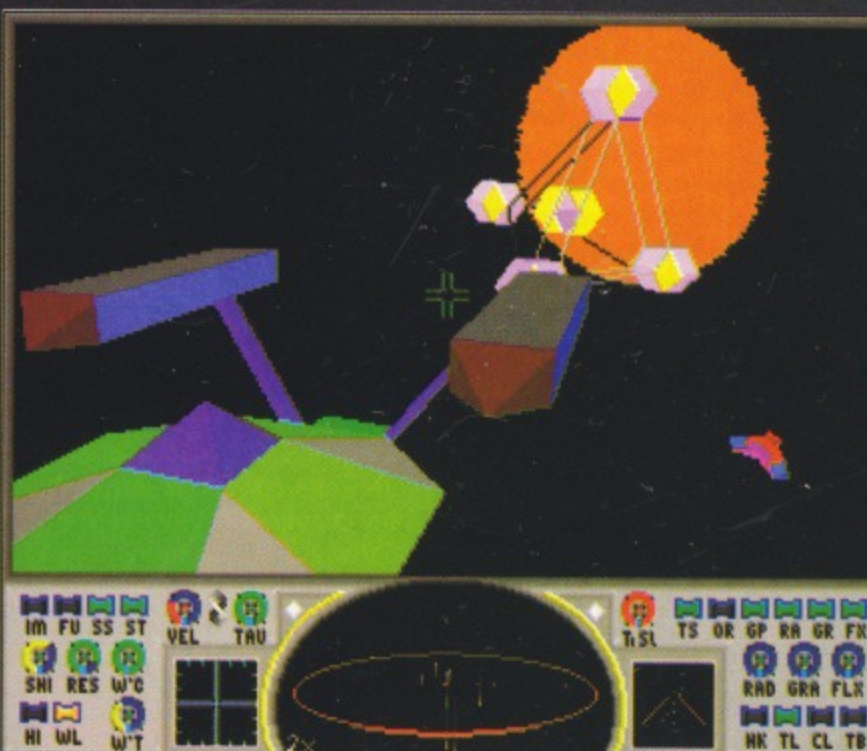

WHENEVER a game arrives for review that has no fancy box, no instructions and isn't by a recognised person or company, a groan goes up all round: *Oh no, here we go again. More people who think they can write good games.* Well that's how Cascade arrived.

So having drawn the short straw, I loaded it up - it's got a pretty icon and the title screen's nice, though it looks a lot like Cataclysm.

Moving on I discovered good graphics on the between-levels screens, password system for levels, return to desktop icon, analogue volume control and on screen help to tell you what everything is. So far so good, and better than expected.

Still no idea of what keys to press but let's click the start icon and see what happens. There's a *Loading level 1* message followed by some text that tells me I've got to collect 10,000cc of water, there's a time limit of five minutes and I've got eight blocks - whatever they are.

Pressing space takes me to the playing screen, nice 256 colours, Mode 13 - better than Cataclysm - and here comes the water. Okay, where am I? Press the standard keys Z, X, and ? and a little ball bearing

...wet, wet, wet

starts moving about the screen. Yup that's me.

So what do I do now? Well the water's pouring down into a room which has an exit blocked by a bung, so it's staying put for the time being. I'll take a look around. Assuming the water behaves as expected there's a hole into which it will fall if it's not blocked off - must be what the blocks are for.

A quick press of Return reveals ... nothing, so I move away and discover that a block remains behind. Great. Next the bungs - how do I remove them? Well I don't seem to have a gun - there's only me, the blocks and the water.

Try running straight into a bung. Yes there it goes and the water stays right where it is - looks like I'm blocking the way. Back off downwards and it follows me down.

Down we go into the horizontal tunnel and the water floods out, behaving exactly like, well, water. It bubbles, it flows and it runs along surfaces and generally downhill.

In fact it's a bit more active than water usually is. It has no surface tension so when a couple droplets land on a surface they don't stick together, they're apt to just zoom off. The surfaces

are frictionless too - once those droplets get going they just keep on moving.

To cut a long story short, the first screen isn't too hard and it helps you get the hang of everything. Instructions in the help file are brief and to the point, and also give you an idea of what you can expect in the later levels.

There are pistons which will only depress when there's enough water pressing down on them, and blocks that prevent your passage but dissolve when they're hit by water.

Some blocks allow you to pass through but not the water, while others allow you to go through only once or only one way. There are teleports - for you, not the water.

Then there are the switches. These can open and close doors, activate teleports or activate water-controlled switches. They change when there's sufficient water on top of them and they too can open and close doors.

But the bane of your water-

moving life will be the exit-sealing water switch. If just one drop of water lands on this type of block the exit is sealed and the level is over.

So is this game like Cataclysm? Superficially yes, it's got water and you have to collect it in a certain place at the bottom - there's no fancy invented plot here, just a puzzle game with no pretensions.

Two onlookers, independently, described Cascade as like Lemmings and that's more accurate. It's got the same highly addictive quality, the graphics are excellent and the sound is used sparingly but effectively.

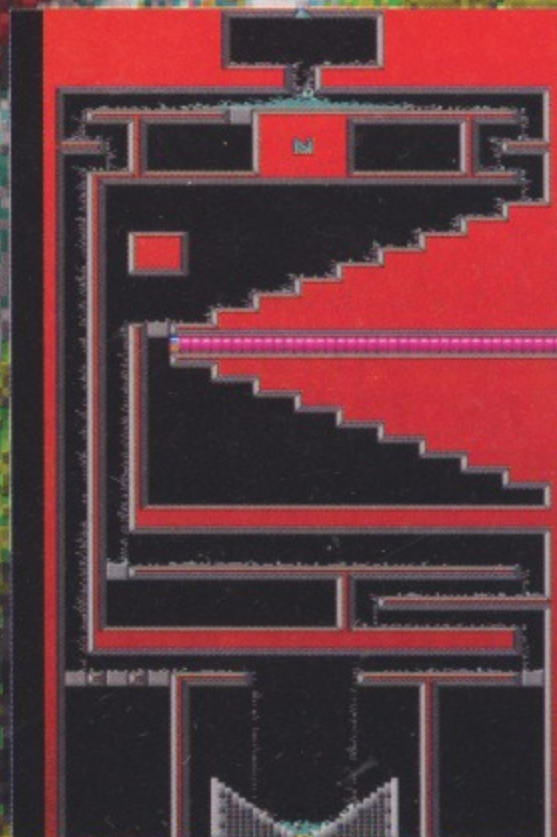
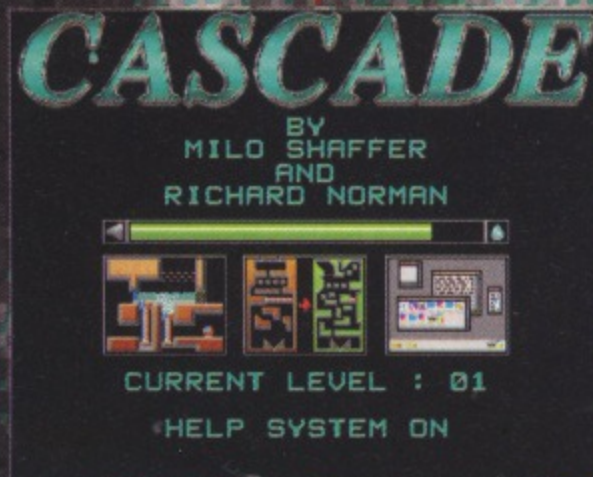
Each level has a password and you're given the next one on completion of a level. If you fail or quit from a level you can just go straight back into it, there are no *lives*, which is also very similar to Lemmings. And it's this feature which aids the *just one more go* syndrome if you haven't quite managed to finish.

If it has any failing at all it's that the gradient of difficulty could be a bit gentler. The Lemmings fun screens led you very gently through the skills needed to play the game at its higher levels.


In Cascade I found level 10 quite hard while level 12 needs to be done so fast you can't afford the slightest error. Level 15 has me stumped - but I'm still going back for just one more try.

I hold up my hand and say I was wrong. This game is not only written by people who *think* they can write good stuff, they *can*. Cascade is brilliant and very reasonably priced. Now go away, I'm trying to work out how to stop the water closing off the exit pipe on level 15.

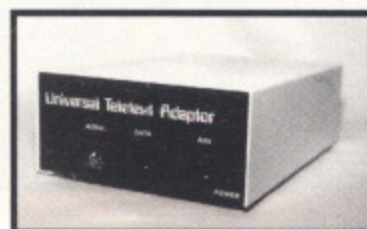

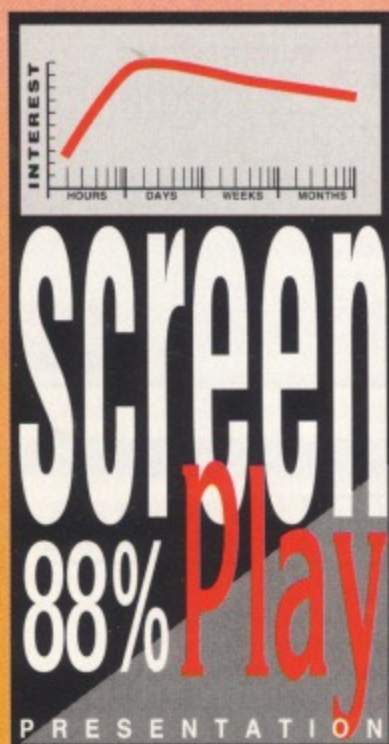

FOLLOWING the recent success of compilation titles on the BBC Micro, it comes as no surprise that they are beginning to appear more frequently on the Archimedes. Krisalis have come up with a superb collection: Pipemania, Mad Professor Mariati, Terramex and a new release, Revelation.

In Pipemania the object is to

construct a pipeline using various angled pieces of pipe, in order to accommodate a liquid called flooz. From the outset this game sounds fun, and it is!

Two players can compete against each other using either mouse, keyboard or joystick and you can choose from three levels of difficulty.

The left hand side of the screen shows the next five pieces of pipe available and the centre of the screen houses the grid where these pieces must be placed. The current scores

are shown at the top and the time before the flooz flows is displayed as a long bar on the right hand side.

Once the action begins, you frantically place your angled pipes, plumbing them into the starting point, which is placed randomly on the screen. The best tip is to plan ahead.



The graphics are superb and the sound is sufficiently pitched in tone and quantity not to break the concentration. This is one of the most addictive games I have played.

Next comes Mad Professor Mariati which uses cartoon-style graphics and has some extremely catchy tunes throughout. This is very much a platform-type arcade game with an eccentric professor who has been ordered to close down his five laboratories containing his various inventions. Unfortunately, all the laboratories are running wild with monsters and

PRINCES. What are they good for nowadays? In years gone by they were pretty excellent. Yessiree Jim Bob. The prince I had in mind was the Prince of Persia and his story goes like this.

While the Sultan is away fighting those evil Christian types the dastardly Grand Vizier has taken over the country and is being generally nasty to the people.

He has also fallen for the Sultan's daughter, but you – the hero – and her, are already in love. El problema.

Being an understanding sort of fellow, the Grand Vizier locks the princess in his bedroom, pops you into a nearby dungeon, nicks your Andy Williams record collection and takes away your Arsenal season ticket – it's not all bad then.

Those splendid people at Domark have decided to let you carry on the tale. You play the part of the Prince and have to escape the platformy dungeon environment and get to the princess to save her from the evil clutches of the Grand Vizier.

The main problem is that you have 12 levels to complete and

just one hour to achieve your goal. You may well have heard of Prince of Persia before, as it has been out on other formats for quite a while – it's even on the Gameboy.

To put it briefly (*please do, Ed*) the game is brilliant, exquisite, superb, magnificent and outstanding. The graphics are not fantastic, the idea not original, but that doesn't matter when the game itself drips playability.

The animation of your character is magic: He walks, leaps, ducks, crawls, tip-toes, hangs, and fences with the greatest of ease. And when I say he fences,

bad guys, ranging from Chip Worms to Mutant Masticators.

You can choose to enter any of the five labs by simply moving to the door and opening it. All the rooms have a totally different theme and whichever lab you decide to enter, you are greeted by ladders, monsters and puzzles.

The idea is to solve puzzles using various objects left lying around. Collecting tokens as you move around will let you purchase additional stronger weapons in place of the spanners, which you can fire to kill or stun the enemies. The graph-

ics are good – just watch the Professor tap on your monitor when you are not moving him or even when he jumps on to the electrical bulbs. Everything on the screen is active.

Your quest in Terramex is to seek out and rescue Albert Eyestrain, the famous Professor, who can be found somewhere in the desert mountain range.

This awesome task is made slightly easier, as you can choose to be any one of five characters, each representing a different country.

Monsters are deadly: Just one touch and one of your pre-

cious lives has gone. It is at this point that I wish there was some means of picking up extra lives on the way though the screens, but never mind. Watch out for the creatures hiding in the rocks, and the water droplets. All are superbly animated.

Puzzles must be solved all the way through and objects must be taken to certain areas, including playing a musical instrument in order to pass the deadly snake.

Terramex is a delight to play, although the lives situation is a bit tough, but having said that it's a game that I am wholeheartedly addicted to.

Last, on this compilation is the new title, Revelation, the idea of which is very strange. Each screen shows the outside lock mechanism of a safe and the dials must be turned in

such a way as to crack the code and get to the contents.

It's a game for one or two players, and you can use the usual controls but personally I preferred the keyboard as it's far more precise. Each safe mechanism is different and you must arrange the wheels to match correctly the coloured arrows on the screen.

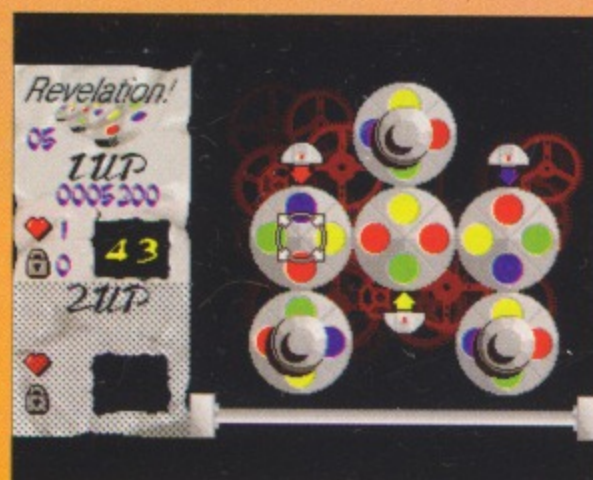
Dials can be turned both ways and have various colours on them. When you're turning, if one wheel touches an identical colour on an adjacent wheel, this will rotate to prevent the colour clash.

This makes it extremely hard at times although you do have a lock facility, which enables you to lock the wheel of your choice from automatically rotating.

Sometimes I found myself completing a screen without even knowing how I had actually achieved it. If you plan ahead, you can predict dials moving and so become expert.

Bonus signs appear, to stop the clock as well as others, which will help in trying the crack the safe – if you're lucky. Unfortunately this game isn't up to the usual Krisalis standards and cannot even begin to match the other three titles, but it is extremely original and makes a refreshing change. Overall, this compilation is superb!

aplenty and all the time the clock is running down.

You may think to yourself that the game is going to be a bit short-lived if you have to complete it in an hour, but it will take months of playing to get to the stage where you can complete all 12 levels in an hour. And every minute you play will be pure bliss as the control system is so wonderful. Any drawbacks? Nope, not really.

Domark are also dithering about releasing the Archimedes version of 'Nam. It's a sort of political/military simulation of the Vietnam war where you play

the President of the USA – a kind of football manager with bullets.

Once again it's been out on other formats for over a year but the Archimedes version is still pending. I expect it sold rather well in the USA because we all know that they are the world champions at war and I can see loads of elderly generals ranting and raving over the screen yelling: "Let's nuke those pinko commies Bubba!" Yes, well, hum.

Don't get too excited though, as on present schedules it could be next year until either game is released. Domark have



had some notable successes on the Archimedes – and BBC B and Master – in the past, but Archimedes new releases from them look like being few and far between. This is a shame as they have some nice offerings.

Days of Steam

...do the locomotion

THE aim of Days of Steam is simple – make as much money as you can by setting up and running a railway system for 12 or 25 years. You begin in January 1923 and – if you take the 25 year option – end in 1948 when the railways were nationalised.

Before starting you have the opportunity to generate one of three levels of map. Basically, the more rivers this contains, the more the level of difficulty increases for the simple reason that every time you build a bridge it costs £100,000 and that tends to eat into profits.

You start with half a million pounds, one locomotive and some passenger rolling stock, plus a map bereft of railways and stations but dotted with the occasional city.

The next task is to choose the site of your first station and it is here that some of the basic rules of the simulation come into play. Three classes of city as well as ports are situated along the rivers and there are two kinds of manufacture – firing kilns and furniture factories.

First and second class passengers will only travel to first or second class cities while third class passengers aren't choosy at all. Second class cities produce export goods which need to be taken to river ports. Here the raw materials of clay and timber can be collected for transport to the relevant factories which then produce building materials and furniture which need to be taken

to cities too.

All these factors have an influence on your choice of routes and rolling stock if you are to be cost-effective and the early emphasis tends to be on cost in a big way. Each station will set you back £100,000 and before you can build a train you also need to install a construction yard – costing a further £50,000.

If you intend to carry exports and such, each station where they are to be collected and delivered needs a goods yard at £65,000 a throw. All of a sudden that £500,000 you start with doesn't look much – and we haven't built a yard of track yet.

That costs between £625 and £1,125 for every 10 miles. You have some control over revenue as you can determine the level of passenger fares within certain limits: £1 per 10 miles travelled is the minimum you can charge and £15 the maximum. The default fares are £12 for first class passengers, £10 for second and £8 for third.

Your aim is to maximise profits, but the rate at which you set fares influences the rate at which cities generate passengers, so it doesn't pay to be scrooge-like too early on. Mind you, once things are going nicely, and cities are proliferating you can gradually start to put the squeeze on.

As time passes and you begin to make a little money the next task is to extend the railway. Lengthening the track and adding stations is the first

option, and building additional trains is another. These options need to be kept in balance since more trains means more revenue – eventually. However, there is that little matter of cost once again.

A locomotive will set you back £50,000 as will a first class coach. A restaurant car – a nice little earner – doesn't come cheap at £30,000 and goods wagons cost anything from £15,000 to £20,000. Of course you can always get an overdraft of up to £100,000 if you fancy paying interest at 35 per cent.

Various facilities are available which enable you to keep track of the load a particular train is carrying at any one time, how much revenue it has generated to date, how many passengers or goods are awaiting collection at any station, how much revenue the station has generated and so on.

You can re-timetable a train at will, though as your network enlarges this can get time consuming. You could alter rolling stock schedules to suit individual catchment areas and generally do just about everything a real railway operator can do.

The graphics are fairly basic. They are informative but the animation of trains was slow on my Archimedes which lacks an Arm 3 chip.

As well as railway buffs falling for this, popping my school governor's hat on for a moment, I reckon this program could be an asset in the classroom at middle school level. Be warned, though, I found it very addictive. I have only one gripe, my son David is above me on the high score table. Greedy swine.

Deadly assistance

The aim of **Nightshade** – apart from just staying alive – is to find four special objects, each of which will kill one of the four otherwise invincible creatures. Start as usual but while the computer is talking to you press both Alt keys. You'll hear a sound like an alarm and the message *Cheat mode. You now have 42 lives* appears on the screen.

In Arthur's court

When playing **Camelot** a general rule is to collect all energy and bags of gold wherever possible. So, from the start go left and then down to collect the first key. Take this to the base of the central tower and open the door. Use the key suspended in the air as a step to reach the ledge.

Go to the top of the tower and collect the rook. On the way down take the second key. At the base of the tower go two rooms right and open the door there with the key.

Go right to the Round Table and the rook will remove the knights. Go up the ladder on the left and collect the pencil from the room you find. Take the pencil to the drawbridge and draw the bridge.

Once it's down proceed left to the dragon's lair and collect the third key. Return to the castle and open the door in the room to the right of the drawbridge. In this tower you will find a spell book – take it past the floating bag of gold to the King's Head room. Press Shift to fire a spell from the spell book to kill the wizard.

Go down the wishing well, then right along a passage until you come to the teleport spell book. Go back to the wishing well and fire the first teleport spell which sets the return point for the teleport itself.

Go down to the very bottom of the well and collect Excalibur, noting the message *Dig at due north*. Go right for the fourth key then fire the second teleport spell to return to the wishing well.

Go back to the dragon, collecting the spade on the way and slay the dragon with the sword. Collect the Holy Grail, go all the way left and collect the gold then return to the opening to the dragon's lair.

Note the pattern in the stars: The top two make a line to the north so dig (go down) directly beneath them, open the fourth door and make your way to the gold. Go back to the throne room, open the door with the Holy Grail and sit on the throne to complete the game.

The puzzle with the stars is pretty tough but anyone who found the crowns in **Citadel** should be able to cope.

Tally ho, Ginger!

Stephen Scott of Englefield, Surrey, has sent me a tip for **Chocks Away** from 4th Dimension which will no doubt be gratefully received by anyone having difficulty with the higher missions.

It's a simple one-liner that allows you to select any mission on the selection screen. Insert disc 1, press F12 and then type:

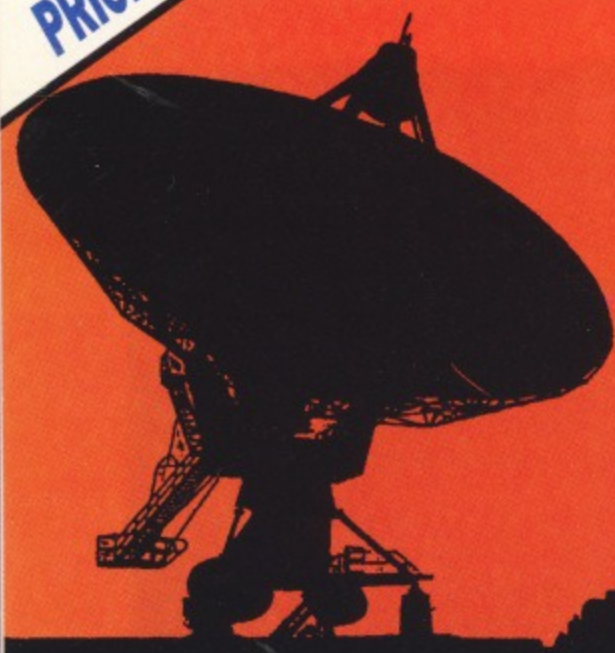
End game

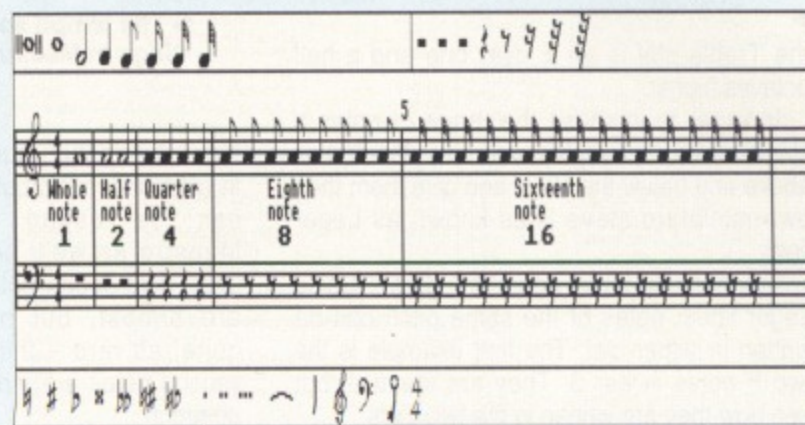

The sound of music

Ian Waugh gets you started with Maestro and music notation

The Archimedes is unique in the world of personal computers as it comes with a range of ready-to-go applications including a music program called Maestro.

This serves as a good introduction to music in general and making music with your Archimedes in particular. Maestro can also act as a springboard to more sophisticated applications such as working with digitised sound samples, scorewriting and sequencing with synthesisers.

In this series we'll go from those very first steps with Maestro to other, more sophisticated applications. Everyone can join in the first few parts of the series as they only require the Maestro program which all Archimedes owners have.

If you like what it can do, you can then consider whether to invest in some of the commercial music programs available.

First steps

Like all Archimedes applications, Maestro is very easy to get up and running. Double-click on the Maestro icon to install it on the icon bar. An even easier method is simply to double-click on a Maestro file which automatically installs Maestro and then loads the file.

The first thing to do is expand the display by clicking on the upper right corner of the window – the toggle size icon – so it fills the screen. It shows more of the score which makes it easier to work with.

You might also like to change screen modes. Click Menu on the Palette icon on the icon bar and select Mode. If you are using a standard monitor, Mode 12 gives you a large

window with big notes which is useful while editing.

Mode 16 – you'll have to enter the 16 at the bottom of the Mode menu – is better for viewing more of the score. For those with multi-sync monitors Mode 31 shows a nice big editing screen while Mode 39 is very wide.

To play a tune, click Menu over the Maestro window and click Select on the Play option at the bottom of the menu. The music will play and the score will scroll across the screen. Click on Play again to stop the playback.

Select Instruments from the menu and drag the pointer across to the right and you will see a window which shows which sounds have been allocated to the staves. If you click on the actual Instruments heading in the menu, the window will stay on screen after the menu has closed.

You can alter the sounds simply by clicking on the names. The Select and Adjust buttons scroll back and forth through the list. At the moment you will probably only be able to select five sounds, the ones which come with the computer but later in the series we'll see how to use others.

Alter the Volume and the Tempo by selecting these items from the Menu. You can load another piece of music by picking up a tune icon and dragging it to the Maestro window.

Music notation

Even though many professional sequencers running on other computers don't use music notation, many of the basic Archimedes music programs do – including Maestro. If you're sitting in a garret creating your own music you may not need notation but it is the most uni-

versal form of music communication in the Western world.

Notation gives you access to a vast range of music including rock and pop, standards, classical and jazz and you'll find it well worth learning. Before we go any further, let's define the terms.

At first glance, music notation may look as though it has been created by a spider which has crawled through an ink pot and walked over a sheet of paper. It's actually not as difficult to understand as you might think. Let's look at the basic building blocks with the help of some pictures from Maestro.

Pitch

Music contains two elements – pitch and rhythm. Pitch is indicated by placing notes on the lines and spaces on a staff made up of five horizontal lines. The higher up the staff, the higher the pitch of the note.

There are over 100 pitches commonly used in music. It would be impossible to show the full range on a five-line staff so clefs are used to indicate where the pitches start. The two most common clefs are the Treble (upper staff) and Bass (lower staff) clefs which you can see in Figure I.

Notes are named according to the letters of the alphabet. The distance between two notes with the same name is eight notes or an Octave. You can see from Figure I that the notes in the same position on the staff in the Bass clef are lower than those in the Treble clef.

For example the note on the lowest line in the Bass clef is a G while that same position in

the Treble clef is an E over one and a half octaves higher.

In order to increase the range of notes a single staff can display, you can place notes above and below the staff and give them their own miniature staff lines known as Leger lines.

You can see these again in Figure 1. Using Leger lines, notes of the same pitch can be written in either clef. The first example is the two F notes in bar 3. They are identical but see how they are written in the two clefs.

You can use as many Leger lines as you wish but the music becomes difficult to read if you use more than three or four. The C in bar four is commonly known as Middle C.

Rhythm

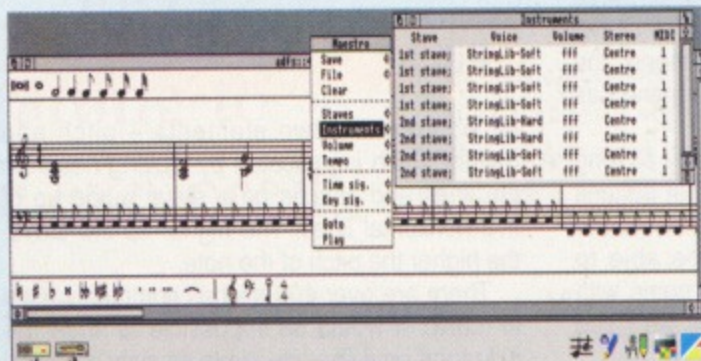
The rhythm determines the duration of each note and is shown by adding tails to the stems of the note heads. Long notes have a hollow head and very long notes have no stem.

Figure 11 shows the most common note durations and their ratios to each other. It's important to realise that each bar in the figure lasts for exactly the same length of time. In other words, if you add up the total durations of all the notes in each bar they are the same.

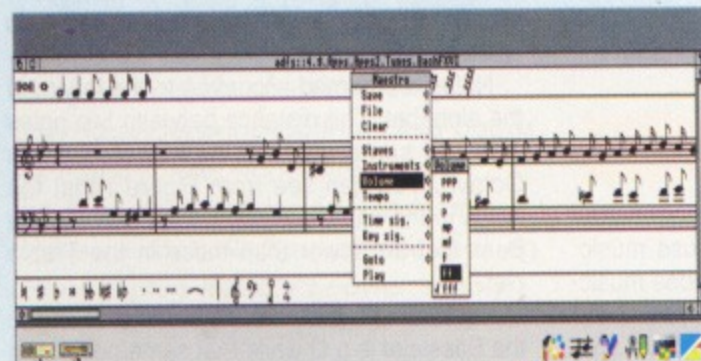
It's also very important to realise that note durations have nothing at all to do with tempo. The speed of a piece is determined solely by the tempo instruction, no matter how many *short notes* it contains. Durations only show the *relative* length of the notes to each other.

Maestro supports three note durations not shown on the staff in Figure 11 but you can see them in the top left of the Maestro screen: The Breve and the two shortest notes – a 32nd and a 64th.

The Breve is rarely used nowadays and is

most commonly found in medieval music but it can be useful in Maestro as we'll see later. Sixty fourth notes are almost, but not quite, as rare – thirty second notes are more common.

Silence plays an important part in music, too, and the equivalent rests are shown in Figure 11 in the Bass clef. The rest symbols for a Breve, Semibreve and a Minim all look the same – a black block – but they occupy different positions on the staff.

A Breve rest fills the second top space on the staff, a Semibreve rest hangs from the second top line and a Minim rest sits on the middle line. Maestro will position these automatically when selected.

Tempo

Tempo instructions are traditionally given in Italian. They sometimes indicate the feeling behind the music as well as its speed – as in Grave.

However, the terms don't indicate an exact speed in bpm (beats per minute) so the performer still has some control over the speed. Some composers, particularly more modern ones, also include a bpm rating on their work.

Largissimo doesn't appear in any music dictionary although the intention is obviously a speed slower than Largo. Lento would have been a better term.

Shown above are the tempo instructions used by Maestro and the approximate bpm speed at which it plays them.

An explanation of the complete rudiments of music would take a couple of hundred pages. However, this article and the next will give you a good basic knowledge of notation, enough to tackle the entry of a piece of music from a score into Maestro.

It's well worth buying a book about notation for reference. For the theoretically inclined there is *The Rudiments and Theory of Music* published by The Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music which contains everything you need to get through graded music exams.

For the complete beginner, however, I can heartily recommend an excellent, easy-to-read

book called *The Basic Guide To How To Read Music* by Helen Cooper published by Omnibus Press and distributed by Music Sales. Both books should be available from all good music stores.

Volume instructions

Standard music notation was developed over the years, mainly by scholars who understood Latin and Italian which is why most musical terms are foreign.

Volume commands are abbreviated instructions derived from three words – Piano meaning soft, Forte meaning loud and Mezzo meaning moderately (literally, half). Piano is a contraction of the word Pianoforte meaning soft/loud.

Here are the volume instructions and their meanings used by Maestro:

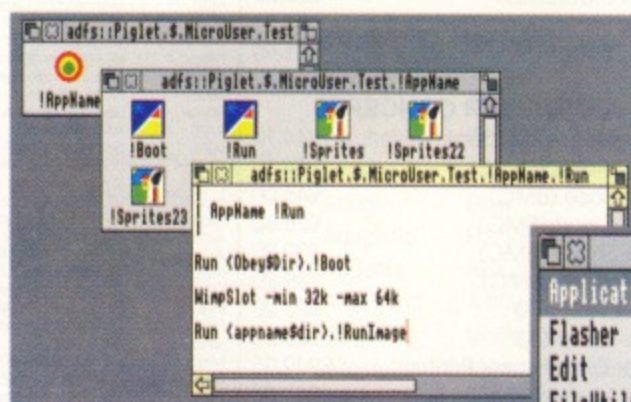

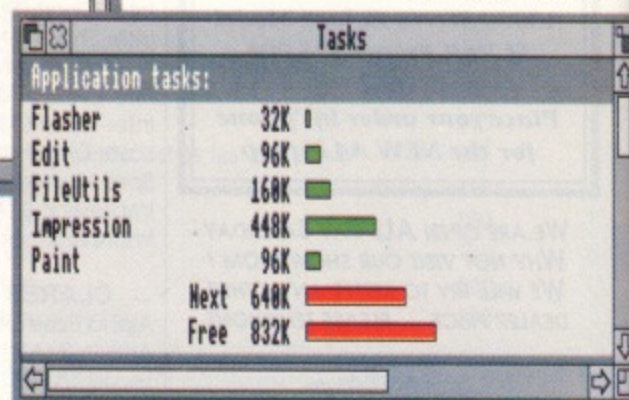

Lebensraum

CREATING applications for the 32-bit Risc OS machines isn't the easiest thing in the world but Acorn didn't make it any easier by spreading the information through four volumes of the Programmer's Reference Manual.

This month we're looking at the environment in which a program runs, which means having sufficient space in which to run, having the necessary system variables and resources on hand and loading any modules required.

Last issue we saw the basic structure of the !boot file and how a command to run the !boot file of an application is also included in the !run files so that no repetition of the data is needed.

The next step is to allocate a certain amount of memory to your program. The default for this is 640k but using the WimpSlot you can allocate as much or as little as your program needs.

The precise syntax for the WimpSlot command is:

```
WimpSlot [-min] <size>[K] [[-max]  
<size>[K]]
```

Looks complicated? Well the first point is that the items in square brackets, [], are optional and those enclosed in triangular brackets, <>, should be replaced by something else.

A typical WimpSlot command would be:

```
WimpSlot -min 64k -max 128k
```

This means: *The next program to be run must be allocated a minimum of 64k but if more is available, give it the extra up to a limit of 128k.*

If less than 64k is available an error is produced and the program won't run.

You can leave out the -min and -max markers:

```
WimpSlot 64k 128k
```

which has the same effect as the example before.

You could also leave out the 128k:

```
WimpSlot 64k
```

but this means something different: Now the program will be given the available memory as long as there's more than 64k, if not an error is generated as before.

If you open the Task Manager window you'll find two red bars marked Next and Free at the bottom of the Application tasks section. It's the bar called Next that is affected by the WimpSlot command. Alternatively you can drag it to various positions. However, a WimpSlot will always override it.

The exception is where the -max value has been left out, in this case the maximum amount of memory allocated is whatever is in the Next slot. Under normal circumstances this will be 640k but you can drag it to any position you like.

Leaving out the k is not a good idea because without it the numbers refers to pages of memory. On a 1Mb machine a page of memory is equivalent to 8k. On 2Mb it's 16k and on a 4Mb (or higher) machine one page is 32k.

So if you've written a program on a 1Mb machine and you've discovered that the fol-

lowing command gives your program enough memory:

```
WimpSlot 8 8
```

someone running the same program on a 2Mb machine will allocate twice as much memory as it needs and a 4Mb computer will provide four times the amount needed – in this case 256k – where 64k would be enough.

Loading modules

If you take a look at various !run files you'll see a command *RMEnsure* occurs quite frequently. This is used to load up a particular version of a software module into the Relocatable Module Area – RMA.

A module is a standalone program that extends the capabilities of the operating system by providing extra commands. It's called *relocatable* because it doesn't matter where it is in memory, it will still work. This is important because you can't know which modules have been run before the one you want is loaded.

A module may be a multi-tasking program in its own right and may put icons on the iconbar. The ADFS is an example as is the Palette or the DTP program !Menon. A module might just add some extra star commands or provide some special services.

The DTP program Impression uses several modules to help it run. One works out how to hyphenate words, while another provides the spell checking facility and so on.

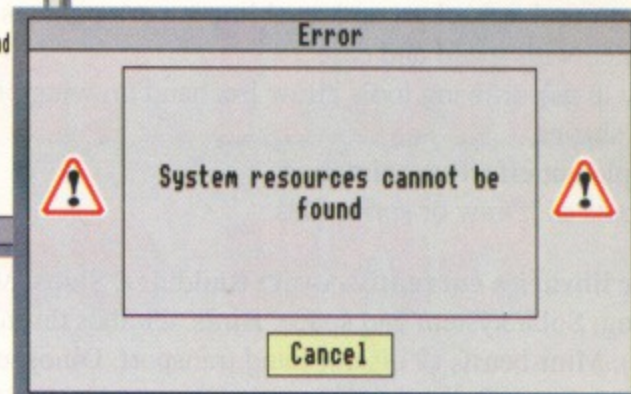
Most programs written in C use the SharedCLibrary, the ColourTrans module and,

perhaps, the FPEmulator – the floating point emulation system. So RMEnsure allows you to check if a particular module has already been loaded. If it hasn't it executes a command, the syntax of which looks like this:

```
RMEnsure <moduletitle> <version number>
[<command>]
```

A typical example is:

```
RMEnsure SharedCLibrary 3.65 RMLoad
System:Modules.CLib
```

This command checks to see if the SharedCLibrary has been loaded and if it has, whether it's version 3.65 or better. If neither is the case, the command is executed.

The RMLoad instruction loads CLib from the modules directory inside the !System directory. But now, what if the newly loaded version of CLib is only 3.5? Attempting to run the main program is going to fail because the version is too old.

What's needed is another RMEnsure but this time a different command is used:

```
RMEnsure SharedCLibrary 3.65 Error You
need version 3.65 of the Shared C Library
or better
```

This generates an error with the text shown and the attempt to run the program is aborted.

System resources

There can be few Archimedes owners who haven't, at one time or another, seen the

dreaded *System resources not found* error. Those not in the know will have probably thrown their hands up in horror wondering what on earth is wrong.

The root of this evil is derived from the need to load modules from the !System directory and another command found in nearly every !run file of a major application, IF. This has the syntax:

```
IF <expression> [then] <command> [[else]
<command>]]
```

This syntax is not quite the same as you'll get if you use *Help IF. This is right, the help information is wrong – otherwise you'd always have to use the word THEN and always have to include ELSE with another command.

When !System is seen by the Filer it creates a number of system variables, of which the most important is:

<System\$Path>

If !System hasn't been seen this variable doesn't exist, using the IF command we can check for the presence of this variable to see whether we can access the system modules.

```
if "<System$Path>" = "" Error system
resources cannot be found
```

So now you know how you can upset new owners as well. This is the standard Acorn-approved error message. It would actually be more helpful to have something like:

```
if "<System$Path>" = "" Error !System
hasn't been seen yet
```

or:

```
if "<System$Path>" = "" Error Please find
!System then try again
```

However, most applications will continue to be unhelpful.

Each module will take up some memory in the machine and the situation can arise when a !run file might load half a dozen modules and then attempt to run the main program only to find there's not enough room.

This is inefficient and wasteful because it now means that memory is being occupied by modules that have no purpose. But it's possible to use the WimpSlot command as a rough guide to whether your program will run once everything has been loaded.

When your program is completed, add up the total space – including modules – that it will occupy. Then right at the start of the !run issue a WimpSlot that checks for the total memory available. If there's not enough the necessary error is generated.

The problem with this is that some of the modules might already be loaded because another program needed them earlier – or perhaps you're re-running an application you'd loaded earlier.

● That's the end of this short series. We've had a look at the elements needed to wrap around the core of an application and it's all fairly logical once you know what's needed – the actual program is your problem.

ONE of my abiding passions is timbered buildings. Not the pale imitation Victorian ones, but the original Tudor halls, some of which could be taken apart and moved wherever their owners were heading next.

My favourite example is Little Moreton Hall in Cheshire. I tried to produce a drawing of the building six years ago using an early CAD program but it never really worked well enough so I was reduced to using a paint package.

This was straightforward but it didn't allow for the bent and twisted timbers to be drawn properly and the end result was far too regular for my liking and lacked character.

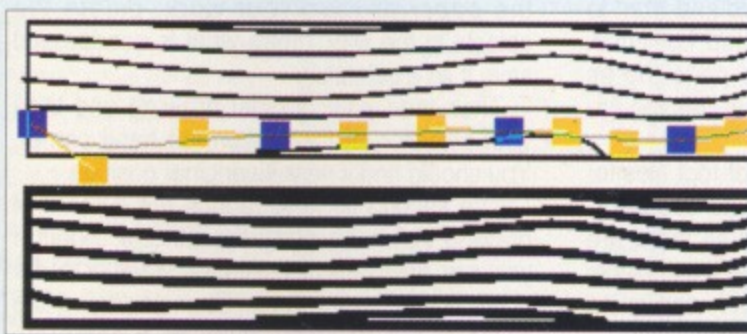
I visited Stokesay Castle with its restored timbered gatehouse in the original sand and natural timber colours – not the white panels and nasty black bitumened timbers seen so often – and resolved to produce a drawing of the gatehouse using the Archimedes.

One of the main problems with this kind of drawing is knowing when to finish. Looking at the monochrome and colour photographs I realised that I could spend weeks drawing the carvings on the doors, brackets and lintels of the gatehouse.

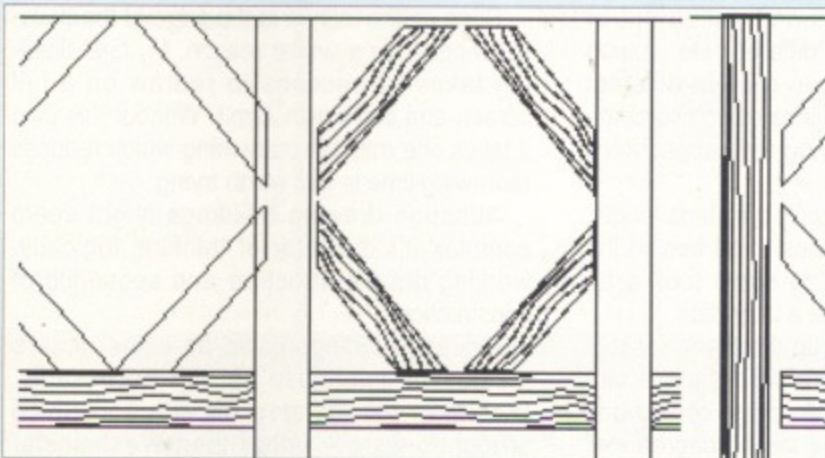
The acid test is how much you can actually see of the detail when printed out at the size you will be using. If it was to be an A4 laser printed high resolution image you would be able to see a tremendous amount of detail down to the oak pegs which hold the building together.

But if you plan a postcard-sized illustration produced on a dot matrix printer you'll see some of the woodgrain but not much carving. We'll be aiming for the latter, you can always add more at a later stage.

The main thing to remember is to start with a basic but accurately proportioned outline

structure and work on the drawing section by section repeating drawn elements where possible.

The advantage of many buildings – including hand-built timbered ones – is that they use identical repeated elements such as bricks, tiles, panels and so on. So you can draw a few basic variations and develop or simplify these where necessary.

First of all produce a rough outline showing the positions of the basic elements of the drawing. For me these were the lower section, the upper storey,

the roof and the window structure. I produced the outline by setting up a landscape A4 DrawPlus page with Zoom set at 3:5 and holding the photograph of the castle at the side of the screen to judge the size and proportion.

The outline can be measured from the photograph and

drawn accurately on screen if *show screen grid* is switched on and you have a screen setting of 0.5 mm on the Grid control panel and a Lock setting of 10 times the screen setting. This gives discrete movements of 0.5mm which is small enough to start with.

The best approach is to regard it as a construction kit which seemed to tie in with the way the gatehouse had been built. I drew a single section of timber which I used for all horizontal and vertical beams as well as the doors.

I modified it to a beam with a bevelled end for one of the main timbers and drew a more complex section of timber at 45 degrees for the barge boards, a simpler section with angled ends for the diamond-shaped decorative panels, a single curved section of timber for the more complex decorative panels, a semi-circular section under the extended window and an arched piece to go over the passage.

Flipping and rotating

There are only half a dozen different sections of timber in the whole drawing. The apparent variation is due to flipping or rotating sections of timber which have been scaled to fit different locations and treated with differing line thicknesses depending on their size.

I was tempted to make everything flush but this didn't work, so I redrew most of the elements with a solid white fill panel at the back so that they could be overlapped or overlap without parts of the element underneath being visible.

The diamond shaped panels were constructed from four diagonal sections of timber made slightly irregular by rescaling. I made the panels slightly larger so that the edges were

definitely hidden once the vertical and horizontal timbers were overlapped too.

The timber originally used in this type of building would vary in thickness and type so a little irregularity here and there adds to the effect. The curved sections would have been sawn from curved branches but this gatehouse was built in the 15th century when builders had started cutting from flat timber.

Next I put the main structural timbers over the outline. You should print out your drawing at this stage to see what degree of detail is visible to save unnecessary work.

The beams should be a fairly solid black to look the same as the photo but I kept the line thicknesses sufficiently thin to show the wood grain. This has to be judged according to the degree the timber has been widened or shortened, and by trial and error you can get a reasonable effect.

Once a section of the main structure was complete – the left hand section of diamond shaped panels – I grouped them so that they could be moved easily and I could change the line thickness in one go rather than having to alter each element separately.

I didn't draw the right hand side but copied and flipped the left hand side and dropped it into place. You can always ungroup one side and move a few bits round to make it look a bit different.

I don't regard copying and flipping as cheating so that's how I produced the roof and the lower section. The roof is symmetrical but the lower part of the gatehouse has a window added at one side which is itself a copy of the window in the triangular roof section.

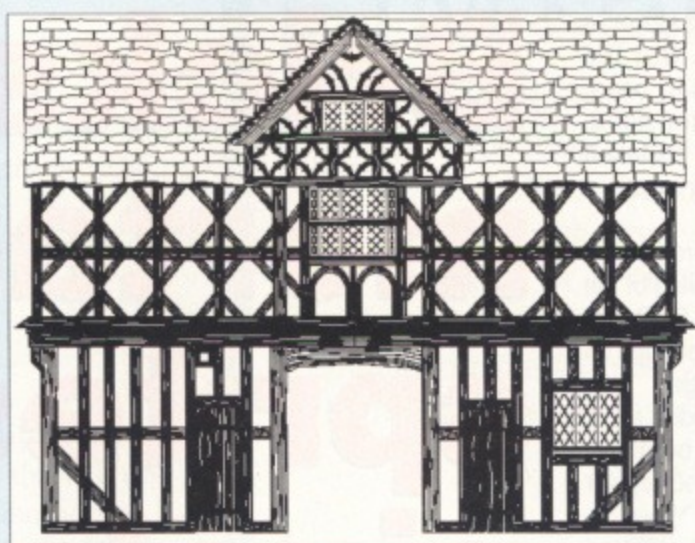
The windows all use the same basic pane constructed with sections of leading or grey rectangular strips of different lengths rotated accurately to 45 degrees. Once rotated these were flipped vertically and horizontally and moved into position.

The main problem is that if the rotated strips are too long you can't shorten them without changing their width. You have to draw another one a bit shorter or longer until you find one that fits. The frame hides the overlap so they don't have to be millimetre accurate.

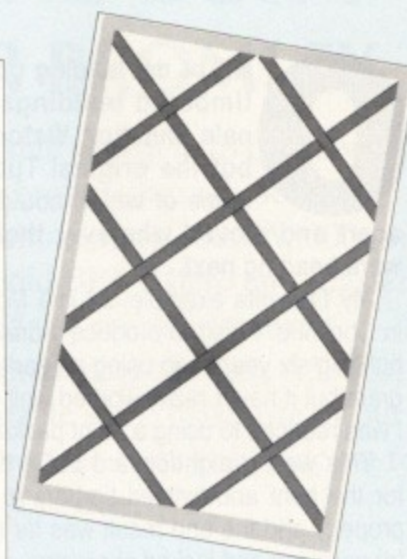
I didn't design the window in situ but drew a rectangle to fit the space, moved it into a clear part of the drawing to work on and then dropped the grouped window into place once drawn. It's much easier to group and ungroup components on a blank part of the screen.

I had to decide early on if this was to be a copy of a photograph with its perspective effects or whether it was to be an architectural elevation. I chose the latter because it's easier to draw and gives a clearer view of the structure and detail of the building.

The other decision I had to take was whether to include the carved figures on the vertical beams on the sides of the window, the carved arches in the panels underneath the bay window and the beautifully carved barge boards above the smaller top window.

I decided to skip these but I plan to add them later. I might try scanning some black and white photos, reducing the scans and adding these but I suspect they won't look as good as hand-drawn carvings, though it would be about a hundred times quicker.

Another important decision to make is how you're going to draw all the timber peg holes used in the construction. It's easier to draw them in a single component which will be repeated rather than having to add them to 50 or 60 separate elements. I decided not to bother at all as you wouldn't be able to see them at the scale I'm intending to print.

Once a section has been assembled you can use *backward*, *back*, *forward* and *front* to make sure all the pieces overlap correctly. This is straightforward with the panelling as elements of the panels and timber framing are either at the front or the back.

But if you take out a section of roof tiles for editing, for example, you'll have to use *backward* or *forward* as many times as there are tiles above or below to move it back into place. So if it won't go straight back just keep going until it does.

The roof tiles were drawn as boxes with the edges turned to curves and pulled out of shape a bit. I drew five different tile shapes and then grouped them in rows in different combinations and orientations using two of the rows alternately and varying their appearance by flipping.

All the rows were originally the same length, I just extended the top ones to go behind the triangular roof section so some look a bit clumsy. I'll change them at a later date.

The edges of the tiles on the triangular roof section were tricky. I drew a solid black rectangle and rotated it to 20 degrees, copied and stacked four or five along the 45 degree roof section. By grouping them and I repeated

them until just below the top where I drew a V-shaped separate tile.

It's easier to draw the barge boards as symmetrical objects and as they would have probably been split from a boxed log and used as a matched pair originally this looks quite authentic.

The problem with the building is that it looks too regular – the timbers are too rectangular and the whole thing looks as though it's just been built which I suppose it has in a way.

Using DrawBender on some sections would give a bit of distortion here and there to give sagging timbers and a wonky roof.

But the gatehouse has a relatively recent roof which is perfectly horizontal and begs the question: What does an authentic timbered building look like – should it be drawn as if it was new, in a state of collapse or restoration?

A couple of tips to finish. If you're trying to group objects from only part of the drawing group them from the edge of the *paper* or save your work, delete the objects in the way, group what is needed and save it as a selection.

Then load your original drawing and then your selection at the bottom left hand corner. You should find it near its original position.

The second tip is to reduce the amount of drawing visible by using the window sliders if you are doing lots of detailed work – to cut down on redrawing time. Even changing the scale of the drawing involves a complete redraw.

Bring up the menus at the edge of the drawing window for a similar reason. My final drawing takes 22 seconds to redraw on a full screen and that's with Arm3. Without this chip it takes one minute so anything which reduces redrawing time is well worth trying.

Although drawing buildings might seem complex it's a matter of thinking logically, working out the structure and sequence of construction.

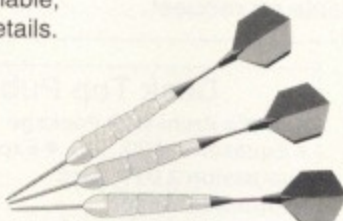
Modern buildings could be easier than a mediaeval gatehouse but not necessarily. Whatever you do, start off with something straightforward – rather than Westminster Abbey.

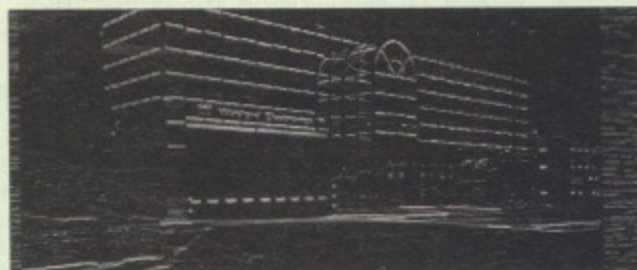

Plotting your steps

MY interest over the last four years has centred around building and running a pen plotter. This allows me to dabble in electronics, practise my programming skills and extend my day job abilities as a toolmaker.

I think that plotter performance for the home constructor has been stuck in a rut for some time. The stepping size and top speed of the pen will not inhibit the final result on paper as long as the step size is not too big. But as the drawings become more ambitious the pen speed does become a bit of a nuisance.

Another annoying symptom is the mechanical resonance which constantly grinds away at the ear. The electronics used on commercial plotters have not been available as a separate item except in low cost industrial packages. These are always over the top when it comes to ruggedness, construction, capacity and price.

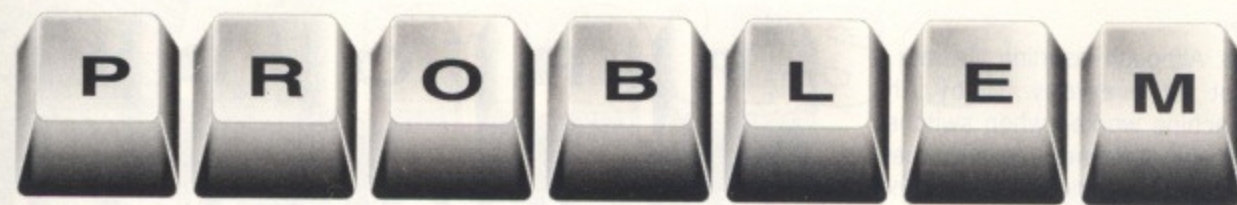
Because none of the usual electronics and computer magazines have shown signs of improving the situation I decided to have a go myself.

I found two good electronics packages by SGS-Thomson, the GS-D200s motor which costs about £30 and can produce stepping rates of 25,000 per second while requiring three inputs per motor or two inputs if you use half-stepping. The second package is a micro-stepping board called the GS-D250M and is an upgrade option.

The software has been written in Basic V with machine code loops. At the moment the program converts HPGL drawfiles and communicates with the GS-D200S through the User Port/Midi expansion card for the A3000, the AKA12. It uses SYS 6,151 (Osbyte) commands to the user port and this is where I have found problems.

The calls are too slow and I wonder if you know why. Although this add-on runs at 2MHz perhaps there is some obstacle. Alternatively, I am quite happy to use the eight lines available on the printer port which for Archimedes owners comes free and ready to use.

Reading the Body Building articles in the February issue, I noted your comments about printer port

usage, having already been aware of the handshaking requirements. I would be grateful for any comments and advice. — **A. Goldasz, Maghull, Merseyside.**

● Most commercial plotters do not use stepping motors for both cost and speed reasons, they prefer a servo feedback system, where the servo loop is an analogue system. This produces a fast response but at the expense of judder. You can see the pen vibrating in some positions even when it's supposed to be still.

With these systems the maximum speed is governed by the pen/paper combination. My plotter, a GraphTec, can use Rotoring pens and ink and I use it to draw twice full-size printed circuit artwork on polyester drafting film.

This pen and paper combination will only work well at the very slowest speed and it can take up

to three hours to produce a drawing. We did cover stepping motors in the May '84 issue but as you say new chips have appeared since and so I plan to revisit the topic soon.

SYS calls are slow because the operating system has to sort them out. Direct access to the hardware is possible but time sensitive operations suffer because of interrupts and DMA cycles, not all of which can be de-activated. One solution would be to build a board that accepted instructions about how many steps you wanted and it went away and produced them.

This is getting towards a dedicated processor board controlling your plotter which for ultimate performance you will have to use.

Finally, mechanical resonance is, unfortunately, a fact of life. All you can do is to design around it and use an armoury of extra weights and damping components.

I have recently upgraded it to the full 4Mb of memory and have filled all the spaces and changed the link. I read 4,096k on start

I AM in urgent need of a printer that prints on till receipt-sized paper, for connection to an Archimedes as I am writing some software for my father's shop. I am unable to find such a printer anywhere. None of my local dealers can help and I cannot find one in any advertisement.

I may also need a barcode scanner and software for the same project and I wondered if there was one on the market. I would be grateful for any advice as I am getting desperate. — **Richard Lucking, Worthing, Sussex.**

● The reason you have not had much success looking in advertisements is that you are looking at end user publications. What you need to do is to look at OEM — original equipment manufacturer — publications or trade magazines. You will find these in large city libraries.

Epson do a range of 16, 24 and 40 column miniature impact printers with both serial and parallel

interfaces for around £80. The model numbers are PU150, PU160 and PU164.

There is also a range of accessories like a printer cover, paper role holder and paper winder. Datac produce a range of panel mounting and standalone dot matrix receipt printers at about £300.

For reading bar codes Penny & Giles produce a system for the BBC model B at £270, which includes the software to produce the bar codes on your printer. It plugs into the user port but some code comes on Eprom so it might not transfer easily to the Archimedes.

Barcode wands and slot readers are made by Hewlett Packard at around £80. They even produce one that contains its own microprocessor and sends Ascii formatted data to the serial port. However, you do pay for this with a price around £260.

up. Although inserting the ram is not an everyday hobby, the machine worked when switched on and there were no error messages nor immediate problems. But how do I know the new memory map is good?

I remember several programs from the BBC B which would test and give go/no go indications of any failures in the map, but I haven't seen such a utility for the Archimedes. Has the machine a self-check feature?

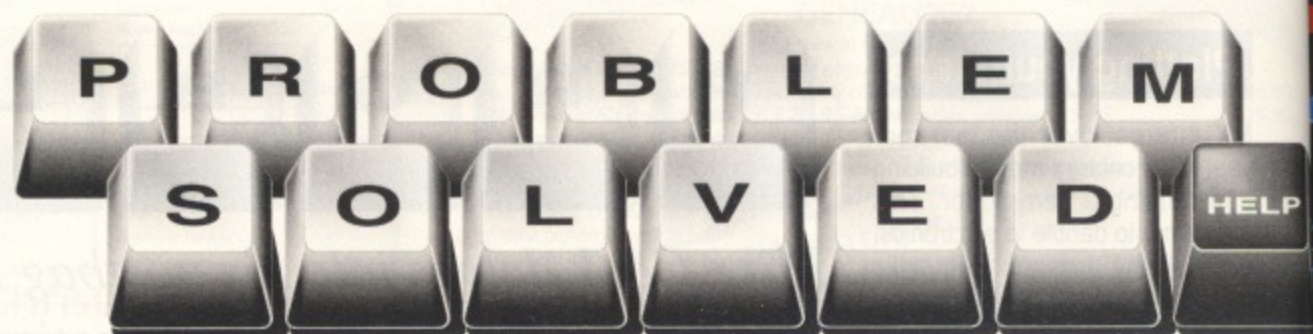
Since the upgrade I am now getting frequent *Filecore* in use errors, an annoying condition that was all but unknown in the 2Mb machine.

Have I caused a fault during the ram upgrade process? It is almost impossible to tell with these memory chips if a chip leg has not *homed* properly.

As I am considering a hard disc upgrade, do you know of any existing literature to advise me, even if it is of a technical nature?

I have long been impressed by the construction articles in the magazine and although my soldering iron retired with me, the urge is still there. Is there any possibility of a project for the computer to carry out the function of a barograph? I have heard that pressure sensor devices are available. — **Gordon Woodside, Dollar, Clackmannanshire.**

● There are memory testing programs for the Model B but most of them were of little use. A good memory testing program is very difficult if not impossible to write. It



is not just a matter of storing something in memory and reading it back to see if it is correct, that only catches one small possible fault.

The majority of memory faults occur with the address decoding circuitry. This means that writing to one location will affect another. Therefore a good memory test program should write a bit pattern to one memory location and test all other locations to see if they have changed. With a large amount of memory this is impossible time consuming.

It is possible that you have had an increase in *Filecore* errors because you are running more applications at the same time. This is a well known bug in Risc OS 2 caused when too many floppy discs have been seen by the Filer — if you always dismount the floppies it won't happen. This bug has been solved in Risc OS3.

Using hard drives is similar to using floppies so most of the information should be transferable. The major difference is due to the size of storage available which leads to a need for more careful planning of your layout of folders and sub-folders.

For example you do not want

too many folders on the top level but you want your *!System* at or near the top. Also your fonts should be pretty accessible.

You might want some applications like *!Edit* and *!Draw* on the top level but remember that when the computer sees an application you lose some memory storing its sprite.

Apart from various magazine articles there's no other independent literature on upgrading.

Finally, the subject of pressure sensors was dealt with in the April '86 *Body Building* article. However, pressure sensors are not cheap and I have seen some tabletop barographs selling at less than the price of the sensor so I will be investigating what is in them. Watch, if not this space, then the one next to it.

Train control

I AM currently studying A-level Technology at Torquay Boys Grammar School. For my main project I am designing an automatic computer-controlled model railway layout suitable for use as a window display.

I am now conducting my

Investigation and Research into the project and I intend to use a BBC B or an A3000. However, I need a suitable interface. Can you give me some advice and information on interface projects featured in the magazine? — **Barry Tabrah, Ipplepen, Devon.**

They can also supply photocopies of past articles for a nominal charge of £1. For control of a model train you need to look at April '91 which showed how to control motors using a solid state driver. This could also be used for changing the points.

You need to sense the presence of the trains and one way is to fit each train with a small magnet and use a reed switch — from January '88 — or a Hall effect switch, look at November '90.

Alternatively you could use infra-red emitters and detectors in the same way as the wind direction indicator which was featured in October '86.

It's no longer Greek for me

I USE my relatively new A3000 for application programming in the PC emulator as well as for music and computer graphics. Needing some DTP I recently bought *Impression* and *Poster*, but I have two big problems.

When I want to put some Greek text in my *Poster* page I find out that the drive is working — reading the fonts — after I do something with the text. I work with 2Mb and a 640k cache and the font is *Trinity.Medium.Greek*. After three or four attempts my Greek transforms into the System font and I have to reset and start again.

The second problem is with the A3000 itself. When I load any disc and then Applications Disc 1, system errors appear such as *Address Exception at &0000708C* and sometimes it insists on going with another

error SWI not known. If I press Cancel and return to the desktop my Draw or Edit icon has been replaced with an App icon.

My Morley memory upgrade is connected properly and the same error occurs if I unplug it and work with the standard 1Mb. Can you help? — **Elias Tekertalis, Athens, Greece.**

● The *Poster* application is reverting to the system font because it has lost your Greek font. In other words the font manager can't find it.

I did have a similar problem when I was writing *BookBinder* and it was a rather subtle programming error. I suspect that *Poster* has the same problem — you should contact its publishers as I know no user fix.

The most common cause of the SWI not

known error is that you have some modules unplugged. To find out if this is so press the F12 key and get the * prompt. Then type UNPLUG and you will get a list of any that are inactive.

To re-activate them type *RMReInit* followed by the module's name. Some software unplugs modules to provide more memory space but unfortunately does not re-activate them.

Your Applications disc has an error on it, it sounds like it is in the place where the *!Draw* application has its sprite file. If the operating system can't read an application's sprite file or if it does not have one it will place a default application icon in its place.

Get your dealer to replace or re-copy your Applications disc.



A mouse by another name

Mike Cook looks at two alternatives to the mouse

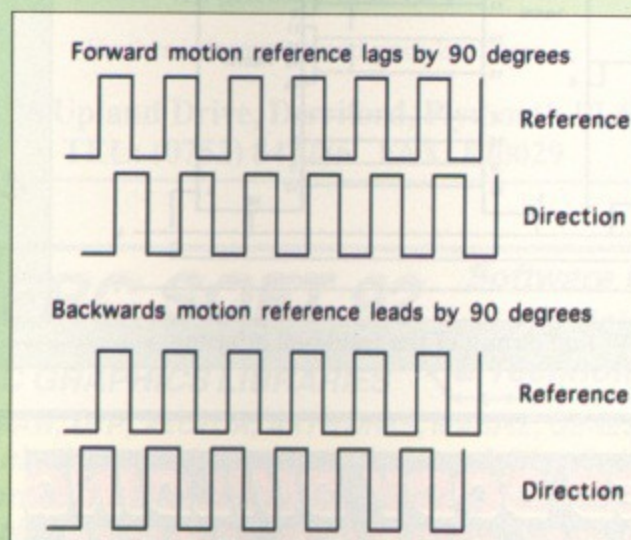


Figure 1: Mouse signals

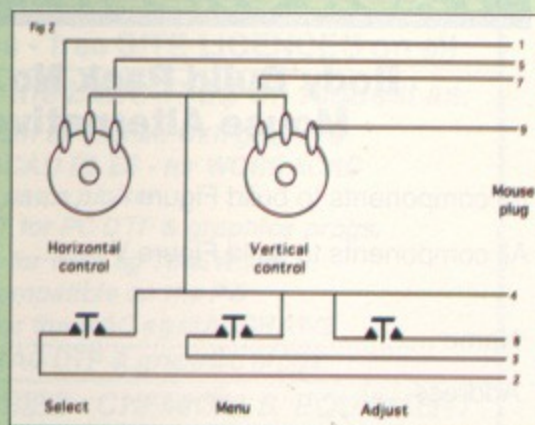


Figure 2: Two control mouse substitute

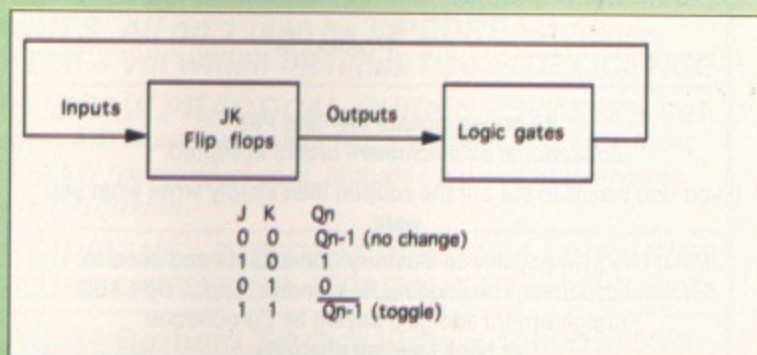


Figure 3: A JK flip flop feedback counter

NOW don't get me wrong, I like mice. Some of my best friends are mice, but would you like your daughter to marry one? I have always found mice ... well a bit wimpish. So this month I would like to look at two alternatives.

Let's start off by looking at the signals produced by a mouse. These are shown in Figure 1 for one direction. Basically there are two signals known as reference and direction that consist of square waves out of phase by 90 degrees – these are sometimes called quadrature signals.

If the movement is in one direction the direction signal leads the reference signal – if in the other direction it lags the reference signal. In that way the computer knows which way the mouse is being moved. These signals are generated by optical slot sensors from movement of the mouse ball.

Any substitute for a mouse must therefore simulate these signals. The simplest substitute consists of two shaft sensors. You would then have control over the mouse using two rotary controls rather like an Etch-a-sketch. While you can use optical rotary shaft encoders, these are quite expensive.

A cheaper alternative would be to use a mechanical system to generate the pulses. There is a control that generates these quadrature signals from wiping a contact over a printed circuit pattern.

This produces quite acceptable results for this application. You will also need push switches to replace the mouse buttons – sim-

ply push to make connections to earth.

The circuit diagram is shown in Figure 2. This arrangement could be useful if you wanted to separate the vertical and horizontal components of positioning. It can also be the basis for other arrangements.

For example, you could arrange a system rather like an XY plotter where moving a pointer moves the mouse position, rather like a graphics tablet. There could be other forms of movement like the amount of swivel on a chair that you can translate into mouse movement.

However, a more conventional alternative to a mouse is a trackball. I always say a trackball is just a dead mouse, on its back with its legs in the air. It has a big advantage in that it does not take up unlimited desk space but just sits in its allotted space and never wanders.

Now some people swear by trackballs and others swear at them. It seems that you either find them useful or useless.

Personally, I find a mouse easier to use when I am using my right hand. However, if I am forced to use my left, I find a trackball much more usable.

Trackballs tend to be expensive but I have an Atari model that I interfaced to my Model B several

years ago. Therefore I thought it was time it came out of retirement to provide an occasional replacement for the mouse.

The problem with the Atari trackball is that it produces different signals than the Archimedes requires. It produces a step which is the same as the reference signal but its other signal is a direction signal. This is high when moving left and low when moving right. Therefore we have to use these two signals to generate two quadrature signals.

This proved a bit more of a challenge than I first thought. My first attempt produced no movement at all and the second was not very satisfactory producing occasional direction reversals. My third attempt does work, and works well, so that's the one I will show you here.

The idea is to use the step signal to create a special sequence binary count. You need one sequence to move to the left and another to move to the right. Therefore, the direction signal should change the sequence these are shown in Table I.

Now you can generate an arbitrary counting sequence using a JK flip flop. This is a digital component I have not used before in any of my articles so I will explain a little of how they work.

Two data inputs are labelled, for no apparent reason, J and K, and there is also a clock input. On the falling edge of the clock the output Q goes to a state determined by the J and K inputs.

This state can be logic one or logic zero, no change or the inverse. To design a counter you have to construct a table of the required input values for each step in the sequence and then read off a logic equation that generates these states from the current output states.

Finally you implement the logic of these equations in a feedback circuit. The basic block diagram is shown in Figure III.

To get the output into any given

state there are two different input combination you can use, either force it to the required level (1 or 0) or let it get there by an inversion or no change from the current state.

This means that for every transition only one signal needs to be specified and the other is in a don't care state. For our problem we need two flip flops which I have called imaginatively A and B. The sequence we need is shown in Table II along with the logic function for each input.

To get the forward or reverse sequence we simply have to switch between the two functions. The diagram of the counter is shown in Figure IV. It looks quite complex but as there are only two chips involved the actual wiring can be shown much simpler.

Remember, we need two of these circuits, one for horizontal and one for vertical movement. The complete circuit is shown in Figure V. This also includes two extra push buttons as the Atari track ball has only one.

Construction is not critical and can be completed on veroboard. In this case however it is best to simply place the chips on the board and use wires to link the various signals. It is a mistake to try and let the tracks pre-make any of the connections.

The 9-pin mouse plug is a little tricky to wire up. Basically the trick is only to bare and tin about 4mm of wire and pre-tin the plug side of the joint. Then bring the wire alongside the pin and apply the soldering iron with no extra solder.

When all the connections are made and tested then fill the back of the plug with silicon rubber to prevent the wires snapping due to repeated flexing.

● I found the Atari track ball a good emergency substitute when my mouse failed and also allowed left-handed operation as I wrote down figures with my right. See you next month providing I have not been savaged by a rampaging mob of redundant mice.

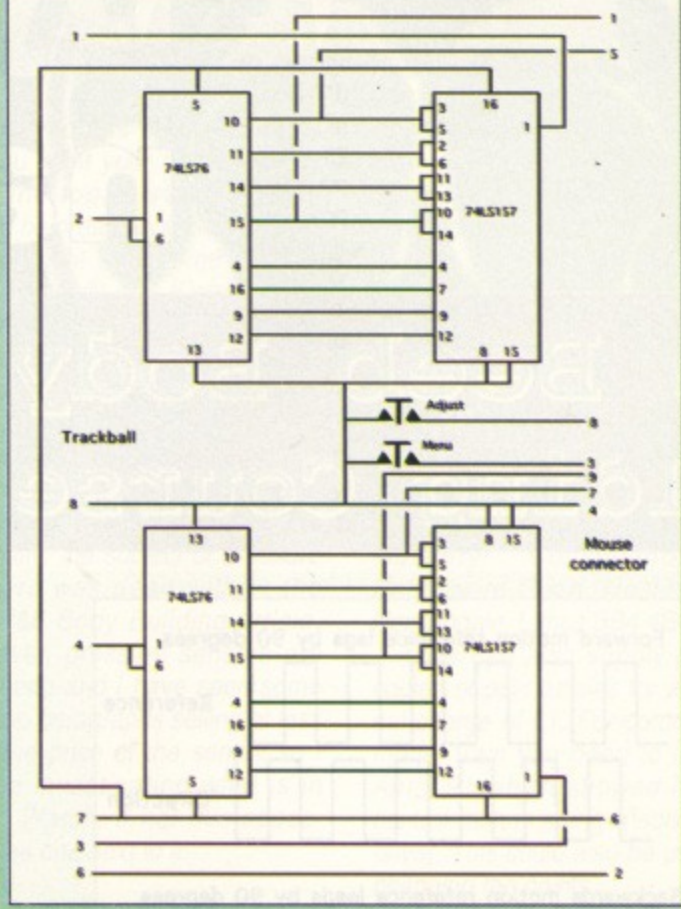
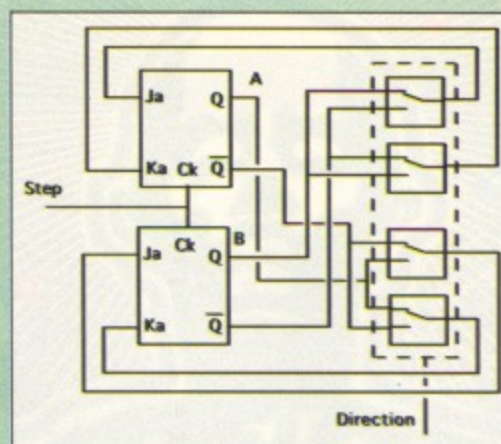


Figure V: Full circuit of the trackball adaptor

Great sounds

GOING on holiday recently I decided to buy some additional speakers that could plug into my Walkman. I tried several low cost pairs and eventually decided on Ross, £14.99 from Argos. The speakers are a two-way system which are either battery or mains operated — a mains transformer comes included in the price.

They sat on my desk for a few days before I had the idea of plugging them into my A3000. All I can say is WOW the sound reproduc-

tion was superb, far superior to the internal speakers and without the hassle of trying to connect them up to my hi-fi with long trailing wires.

If you want exciting sound reproduction and good quality, smart-looking speakers, give them a try, you won't be disappointed. — David Edwards, Taunton, Somerset.

Rodent friendly

I HAVE found an interesting feature on the A5000: If the pointer is over a menu item with an arrow leading to a sub-menu and the menu button is pressed very slightly the sub-menu appears as if the pointer has been moved to the right.

This doesn't happen if the menu button is fully pressed and it doesn't happen with my A3000. I have tried find out if this returns a value using Mouse X, Y, Z but no value is returned. I wondered if this feature is meant to be built in as some kind of fourth function button or if it is some kind of hardware bug — though I would have

thought this unlikely. I would be grateful for any comments. — Oliver Clark, Redland, Bristol.

● Actually you don't need to press the mouse button at all — there's no halfway position. If, on the A5000, you stop for a moment over a menu option that has a sub-menu then after a pre-determined delay the sub-menu is opened automatically — Acorn copying Apple again. You can turn this off and on using the Configure utility supplied on the rom.

Memory or storage

I HAVE an A3000 with 1Mb which seems no problem apart from the memory. I also bought the internal RTFM Joystick interface. Since I have no technical knowledge I want to know how I can get another 1Mb or hard disc.

I think all the memory upgrades are internal so I'm not sure if I can upgrade the ram. If it isn't then I'd like to add a hard drive but external ones are much more expensive than internal ones. Also I don't understand the difference

What's in a name: Archimedes or Acorn?

AS the proud owner of an Archimedes 310, I have recently become concerned about the future of this machine. With the apparent demise of the 400/1 series will hardware such as IDE drives, ram expansions, compatible podules and Risc OS 2 compatible software cease to become available? They do not seem to be advertised by large dealers such as Watford Electronics

Incidentally, if the 400/1 series has been discontinued does this mean that the Archimedes computers are no longer in production — the A3000 is always referred to as the BBC A3000. Does the same apply to the A5000 and A540?

I have heard that the roms from an A5000 do apparently work when fitted in a standard Archimedes, even without an Arm3. Can you confirm this and does it mean that Acorn will eventually release Risc OS 3 as an upgrade?

I have been watching the news pages with interest since last November but have not seen anything about a possible upgrade. If so, how much would it be likely to cost?

I would also like to comment on the article in the June issue about badly written applications. The points made are quite valid but I would like to draw your attention to an additional problem.

When starting an application from within another using SWI Wimp_StartTask or in a

!Boot file, the Run command is vital. Without it the filing system name seems to get lost. Therefore, if the following line was used in a !Boot file:

```
adfs::Disc.$.!Edit
```

to run the !Edit application on the ADFS disc called Disc the system variable containing the path would contain:

```
:Disc.$.!Edit
```

This would not become apparent until Edit needed to access a file in its directory, such as the Task Window module. Even then, if the default filing system was still ADFS, the problem would go unnoticed.

However, if another filing system is selected, a file not found — or similar — error will occur when Edit tries to access its own directory. So it's safest to use:

```
Run adfs::Disc.$.!Edit
```

● That's a good point about the Wimp_StartTask command — it's one of those features we come to know and love.

Risc OS 3 does automatically configure

itself to run on the earlier machines and with the release of 3.10 — which corrects numerous features of the original version — it is now ready for general release.

Acorn will be making it available as an upgrade but they haven't given a date yet. The 300 series machines will need an expansion board because the Risc OS 3 rom chips have more pins than the Risc OS 2 ones. Acorn will probably leave these upgrades to third-party suppliers.

Hopefully the price will be kept down for the upgrade, just as the upgrade from the original Arthur OS to Risc OS 2 was kept to just under £30. However a price of £50 seems more realistic in this case as Risc OS 2 will continue to be supported. Having said that, Acorn have not been noted for sensible pricing in the past.

What's in a name, well quite a lot really. You're right, the Archimedes machines — the 300 and 400 series — are no longer in production. Risc OS 3 uses an Acorn symbol for the Task Manager on the right of the iconbar.

However a recent newsletter from Acorn indicated that using the word Archimedes as a catch-all for the 32-bit machines is acceptable. On the other hand new owners generally won't know what an Archimedes is.

better programs – like !IceCream – or more of them.

But very soon after that you'll really feel the need for a hard disc because you'll want faster access to the programs you're running. So go for the upgrade in memory first, a 2Mb machine is the sensible size – notice that you can't get a 1Mb A5000 or A4. It'll cost about £65, or £75 for a version that can be upgraded to 4Mb at a later date.

If you get a SCSI drive you need a SCSI interface to go with it, so it uses up your expansion socket, although with SCSI you can, theoretically, plug in lots of other pieces of hardware. With the A3000 my preference is definitely an internal IDE, a 20Mb one will cost about £450.

Get the know-how

between IDE and SCSI – which should I go for if a 1Mb upgrade isn't possible?

I am on a very tight budget so I need the cheapest option and only a low capacity drive. Does the hard disc increase the memory available or does it just mean more storage space? If I bought a hard disc would I be able to run programs such as the Ice Cream demo? – **Greg Thomas, Bridgewater, Somerset.**

● All memory upgrades are internal and involve simple plug-in tasks – although if you do it yourself you will void your guarantee. Some hard discs are internal and have the same effect on your guarantee.

The choice between extra memory and a hard disc is very difficult, ideally you want both – of course. On balance extra memory is probably better first because you'll be able to run bigger and

ON LAST month's subscription disc there is a program called Ice Cream which contains a large number of programs. Having double-clicked on the icon in the directory viewer an icon installed itself on the iconbar.

I opened the directory and attempted to run several of the programs but to no avail – I was continually rewarded with No run action for this file type.

Do I need to configure my machine in some way? Some of the files were listed as Basic but I still had no joy. Even from the command line it was impossible to find the way through the adfs path to the file/program I wanted.

The ReadMe file warned of the need for 2Mb of ram and MEMC1a chip – I have an A420/1 with 4Mb but I have no idea what MEMC I have. Perhaps you could throw some light on this?

Could you also tell me if it is possible to decompress the files

Master emulator needed for A3000

WE HAVE about 80 BBC Master 128 computers in our school. We are now starting to buy A3000s. Some of the software we have will run under emulation using the !65Host.

Software written for the Master will not run under this emulator. There must be hundreds of schools who would like to be able to emulate a Master on a A3000. Do you know where we can get hold of one? Acorn do not make one and I don't know of a company that does. – **John Page, Solihull, Birmingham.**

● There is no Master emulator and I doubt there will be one, but we certainly agree that one would be very useful – and probably quite profitable. Any takers?

on the monthly disc so that they can be saved in uncompressed format on a floppy so that any Basic programs can be listed and run without the hassle of trying and failing to unravel the filing system. As far as programming goes I think that I must be a non-starter.

This problem apart there seems to be a singular lack of type-in programs in the mag these days while they used to be quite plentiful in pre-Archimedes days. Where are they now?

I realise that the Archimedes machines are more complex than the BBC and Master series but a lot of good programs were written in Basic then. Now we have Basic V which is supposedly even more powerful – what's gone wrong? – **W. Cummins, Chingford, London.**

● To run the Ice Cream programs you click on the iconbar icon – you do have a MEMC1a chip if you have an A420/1.

I'm really not sure what your problem is with Basic programs and filing systems, all the programs can be extracted from the archives just by dragging them, just as you'd copy any other program from disc to disc.

As far as listings are concerned you've really answered your own question, you certainly can do more with Basic V, but it takes a lot more space.

Educating Archie

I WILL soon be starting my music GCSEs and wonder if you could give me any advice on music software/hardware available for a 1Mb A3000. I have seen various adverts in your magazine for Rhapsody II, Notate and so on but I am unsure which is best.

I would like to know what I need to use a Yamaha PSS480 Midi keyboard to make use of a program's Midi facility. To print our scores I'd be using a Star LC-200 dot matrix printer. Can I use the printer driver on the Applications discs?

I have been having a problem with this printer as it prints a line of code at the top of the first page then moves on to the next sheet or it prints everything on the first centimetre of the page. – **Toby Garfath, London.**

Ian Waugh replies: Best is a very relative term because it depends on what exactly you want from the program. Both Notate and Rhapsody have their pros and cons, Rhapsody has more features and is probably the better choice for pure music creation. The February 1992 issue of *The Micro User* contains a review of Notate and a comparison of features with Rhapsody 2.

The emulations specs for the Star LC-200 claim it is full industry standard compatible which I take to mean it supports the Epson FX and LQ emulations. Selecting these in the !PrinterDM printer driver applications should work.

Your current printing problem is most likely caused by incorrect line feed/page feed settings which are used to move the paper on after printing a line or page. Most printers let you alter these from the front panel or with a set of DIP switches.

If it is a fault of the feed setting on the printer you'll probably have problems printing text too. Did you print your letter on the LC-200?

Some software lets you alter these settings, so if text prints OK you may need to look at the setting in the graphics software or explore both options.
